1. REVIEW OF NEW LEGISLATION

- AB417** **PUBLIC CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS; RETAINAGE**
OPPOSE, because the bill would reduce the City's ability to effectively manage construction contracts.
- AB164** **DRIVER IMPROVEMENT SURCHARGE**
FAVOR, because the bill would provide funding to the City to help law enforcement prevent alcohol and drug related crimes.
- AB419** **UNPAID TOWING AND STORAGE CHARGES ASSOCIATED WITH PARKING TICKETS**
