# Case 09-011115, 12/03/09 at 0815hrs. West Allis Cigarette Depot, 7023 W Greenfield Ave

On the above date and time officers were called by a staff member of Dotke Alternative High School in regards to a theft of \$907.50 worth of bus tickets. Through investigation it was learned that a student had stolen the tickets and then sold them to an employee of the West Allis Cigarette Depot for \$200.00. The employee and the owner of the store who is the employee's brother also lied to the detectives when questioned at the store. Both parties were arrested and charged at the Milwaukee County District Attorney's office with Obstructing and the party who bought the tickets was also charged with Receiving Stolen Property.

### Case 09-011215, 12/07/09 at 1000hrs. Cigarette Depot, 1520 S 84 St

On the above date and time officers assisted members of the State of Wisconsin Criminal Investigation Division, Alcohol and Tobacco Enforcement Unit at the Cigarette Depot. It was learned that the owners failed to procure the necessary permits to run the business after buying it. After checking inventory it was also learned that all tobacco stock at the store was illegally obtained. All tobacco stock was confiscated.

## Tobacco and Alcohol Compliance checks;

On December 19<sup>th</sup>, 2009 Ptm Ketterhagen performed a tobacco sales compliance check at 22 random businesses and all were in compliance.
