2. [26-0238](#) Consideration of Request by Kara Zinker to revise the February 26th, 2025 Dangerous Dog Order decision issued for Dusty at 3053 S 82nd St. Apt 1.

Kara Zinker, and Andrew Robins were present.

Weigel moved to uphold the Dangerous Dog order for the dog Croix, owned by Sebastian Laverde with the regular mandatory conditions imposed by City ordinance, with the understanding the order may dissolve after one year if the dog does not display any further misbehaviors.
