RE: Recycling Contract with West Allis Salvage

Dear Mayor and Council Members:

The City of West Allis entered into an agreement dated October 1, 1994, with West Allis Salvage Co., Inc. for the recycling/processing of recyclable materials collected by the City of West Allis. The contract entered into at that time was to expire on September 30, 2001 unless, as provided in the contract document, both parties wished to extend the contract for another three year period. To that end, the original contract was modified and extended for the additional three years on March 27, 2001 by action of the Common Council.

The amended contract provided for, among other things, the City to have the exclusive right to extend the terms of the contract for another twenty-seven (27) month period by notifying the contractor, in writing, of its intent to do so no later than six months prior to the expiration of the contract.

This communication is intended to inform you that the Department of Public Works has been extremely satisfied with the working relationship it has had with West Allis Salvage since the inception of the City's recycling program over fifteen years ago. Furthermore, it is my opinion that the terms and conditions of the current contract, which will remain unchanged under the extension of the contract, are both fair and equitable. As such, it is my intention to implement the "extension" provision of the current agreement, effectively continuing the existing contract with West Allis Salvage through December 31, 2006.
