2. <u>22-0192</u> Appeal of Dangerous Dog Orders by Nereida Cruz, issued on March 25, 2022 at 2228 S. 78th Street.

Ald. Weigel moved to uphold the Dangerous Dog Order with the conditions established in Section 7.126(6) to include:

7.126(6)(f) - Spay and Neuter Requirements - Within thirty (30) days after a dog has been designated dangerous, the owner or caretaker of the dog shall provide written proof from a licensed veterinarian that the dog has been spayed or neutered.

7.126(6)(e) - Signs - The owner or caretaker of a dangerous dog shall display "dogs on premises" signage.
