The current fleet management plan has these apparatus serving an additional one to three years in front line daily use and then another approximately eight to ten years in reserve status. If the repairs are not made the vehicles will not be fit for their remaining service life in the fleet and used vehicles will need to be purchased to replace the existing two engines. The current market cost of comparable replacement vehicles significantly exceeds the cost of repairing the current vehicles.
