To whom it may concern:

I, Carlos Rodriguez, am hereby filing a request for a dangerous dog order case to be heard beyond the 30 day filing period. My reasons for not filing within the 30 day filing period are as follows:

- After signing the quarantine order at the police department, I filed a request for the police report on 9/28/2017 (see attachment one and two, respectively). I was informed to wait 10 days prior to calling to see if the report was ready. I work full-time during the City of West Allis Record Division's business hours. I requested that my girlfriend's father (the homeowner of the property at which the incident occurred) attempt to collect the report in person at the West Allis Police Department in lieu of myself. He was informed that the report was never filed and to put in another request for the report (see attachment three). This was approximately three weeks after the original filing date. The representative informed him that the report would not be available for an additional 10 days, falling outside of the 30 day filing period. Today, on 10/30/2017, my girlfriend successfully obtained the police report and was told by the city clerk to file this notion because it is beyond the 30 day filing period.
 - O The reason I wanted the police report in order to contest the dangerous dog order was due to discrepancies between what happened on the day of the incident, the quarantine order, and beyond. The police stated on the day of the incident that nothing needed to happen to Romeo (the dog for whom the dangerous dog order is issued) because he had **not** bit a human nor an animal. The officer who came later on the day of the incident encouraged me to contest the order due to there **not** being a bite wound and due to comments made by the other party involved in the incident (I have video evidence which I would like to present if I am granted permission to contest my dangerous dog order). The next day, I was informed that Romeo needed a 10 day quarantine due to a doctor being unable to discern whether or not the other party was bit. At this point, I began to question what the official accounts were from all parties involved (police, self, other party, witnesses) and wanted the report in order to contest specific portions of the dangerous dog order. Due to the unavailability of the report within the 30 day period, I did not feel it would be wise to contest an order without specific, official documentation from the incident.
- As a side note, there were extenuating circumstances that occurred during the 30 day period.
 My girlfriend and I both work full-time and have a child on the way. My girlfriend's father
 suffered from a third blood clot and had an IVC filter put in during the 30 day period. He is also
 slated to meet with a cardiovascular surgeon due to findings from an emergency room visit
 during this timeframe. The past 30 days have been a very busy and stressful time period and
 added to our inability to follow-up in a more diligent manner regarding the police report.

It is my hope that the aforementioned reasons are deemed sufficient in order to still contest the dangerous dog order. Romeo is a loved and valuable member of our family and I would be distraught to not present my reasons for contesting the dangerous dog order before the board.
