The City Attorney's Office investigated your claim and determined that the City was not able to admit liability. Therefore, our office has concluded your claim is to be disallowed and denied. The reason(s) for the decision to disallow your claim includes, but is not limited to, the following:

West Allis Police Officers were in the midst of a felony pursuit of a suspect when you also happened to be using the highway. Our officers did everything possible to safely and effectively respond to the pursuit. There is nothing the City or our employees could have done to prevent what happened to your vehicle. However, it is possible that you could seek restitution in the criminal matters which resulted from the unlawful fleeing. That would be case 19CF1766 in Waukesha County. You may be able to contact the Waukesha County District Attorney's Office, (262) 548-7076, and talk with them. They may not even be aware that you are a victim and suffered a loss as a result of that criminal conduct.

The City is not required to provide an explanation for its decision to disallow a claim, but one is provided so you know how the claim was evaluated. The City is required by law to inform you that no lawsuit may be brought on this claim against the City of West Allis or any of its officials, officers, agents or employees after six months from the date of service of this letter.
