Appearances:

Edward Lipinski, 9631 W. Schlinger Ave., questioned the timing of the project, the heavy trucking for the zoo interchange, why isn't the WI DOT paying for part of the project, who will seal and repair the road in the future, and if the City has coordinated this project with the other utilities.

Kimberly Cosby, 9309 W. Schlinger Ave., stated that not all households budgets are the same and not everyone can afford this special assessment.

Anthony Marciniak, 9514 W. Schlinger Ave., commented on the height of the existing curbs with the additional thickness of the road. Mr. Marciniak supports the street improvements.

Jewel Molthen, 9218 W. Schlinger Ave., questioned the timing of this project and why more notice of the street improvement couldn't be given to residents; and the width of the her property line versus what was given in the estimate.

Dennis Cherubini, 9244 W. Schlinger Ave., questioned if this program qualified the Capital Improvement Program. Mr. Cherubini commented on the equipment that has been going down Schlinger Avenue and why the DOT isn't paying for a portion of the road.

Jim Fronberry, 9417 W. Schlinger Ave., commented on when the homeowners were notified of this project; and commented if there is insurance on the roadwork and if the property taxes pay for a portion of repairs.

Dale Cantwell, 9700 W. Schlinger Ave., questioned what the cost of the project in 2011 was versus what the cost is now and why the residents can't pay for the cost in 2011.

Marge Lipinski, 9631 W. Schlinger Ave., commented on the cement and breakage of the road.

Josh Trabeau, 9214 W. Schlinger Ave., questioned the method used to break up the road and stated the road is still in good condition.
