RESOLUTION FOR A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR NUBIAS KOUTURE, A PROPOSED MASSAGE THERAPY USE, AT 2363 S. 102ND ST.

WHEREAS, Audryunna Tate of Nubias Kouture, LLC, duly filed with the City Clerk an application for a conditional use permit; pursuant to Sec. 19.14 and 19.32 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City of West Allis, for a Massage Therapy use; and,

WHEREAS, after due notice, a public hearing was held by the Common Council on January 10, 2023, at 7:00 p.m., in the Common Council Chambers to consider the application; and,

WHEREAS, the Common Council, having carefully considered the evidence presented at the public hearing and the following pertinent facts noted:

1. The applicant has a valid offer to lease the property located at 2363 S. 102nd St., from property owners. The subject property is described as follows:

All the land of the owner located in the Northwest ¹/₄ of Section 8, Township 6 North, Range 21 East, in the City of West Allis, Milwaukee County, State of Wisconsin, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the Northwest corner of the Northwest ¹/₄ of said Section 8; thence Westerly, 1014.48 feet, along north line of said Northwest ¹/₄ and centerline of West Lincoln Avenue, to the west right-of-way line of South 102nd Street, extended; thence Southerly, 344.90 feet, along said west line to the point of curvature; thence Southwesterly, 101.04 feet, along the curve whose radius is 355.00 feet , to the Point of Beginning, thence continue, Southwesterly, along said curve, 172.69 feet, thence Southwesterly, 8.88 feet; thence Northwesterly, 270.69 feet; thence Northerly, 110.00 feet; thence Easterly, 360.25 feet, to the Point of Beginning.

2. The applicant proposes to establish a massage business.

3. The aforesaid premises is zoned C-4 under the Zoning Ordinance of the City of West Allis, which permits massage businesses as a Conditional Use.

4. Adjacent properties are zoned and developed for commercial use.

5. The use, value and enjoyment of other property in the surrounding area for permitted uses will not be substantially impaired or diminished by the establishment, maintenance or operation of the conditional use.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of West Allis that the application submitted by Audryunna Tate, d/b/a Nubias Kouture, LLC, for

a proposed massage therapy use, to be located at 2363 S. 102 St. be, and is hereby granted on the following grounds:

That the establishment, maintenance, and operation of the proposed use, with the imposition of certain conditions hereinafter set forth, reasonably satisfies the standards set forth in 19.14 of the Revised Municipal Code, so as to permit the issuance of a conditional use permit as therein provided.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said conditional use permit is granted subject to the following conditions:

1 Site, Landscaping, Screening and Architectural Plans. The grant of this conditional use permit is subject to and conditioned upon:

a. Site, Landscaping, and Architectural Plans approved by the West Allis Plan Commission on December 7, 2022. No alterations or modification to the approved plans shall be permitted without approval by the West Allis Plan Commission.

2. Building Plans, Fire Codes and Licenses. The grant of this conditional use is subject to building plans being submitted to and approved by the Code Enforcement and Fire Departments. Any applicable licenses shall be applied for and approved. Capacity shall be in accordance with limits of occupancy load calculations as approved by Code Enforcement and Fire Departments.

3. Vehicle Parking. Provided on site are 54 existing parking spaces, that includes 4 ADA stalls, are provided on-site.

4. Operations. The business shall maintain records of customer appointments and install cameras in customer lobby area.

5. Signage. Signage shall be permitted in compliance with the West Allis signage ordinance.

6. Deliveries and Refuse Collection. All refuse to be provided by a commercial hauler. All refuse, recyclables and other waste material shall be located indoors and/or screened from view within a 4-sided enclosure or as approved by the Planning & Zoning office to match the building. All tenants of the property will be required to abide by the City of West Allis health/public nuisance rules per Chapter 7 of the Revised Municipal Code.

7. Outdoor Lighting. All exterior lighting fixtures and/or lighting visible from public right-ofway shall be indirect and shielded in such a manner that no light splays from the property boundaries. Lighting is subject to a photometric lighting plan being approved by the Plan Commission.

8. Expiration of conditional use permit. Any conditional Use approved by the Common Council shall lapse and become null and void 1 year from and after that approval if the use has not commenced, construction is not underway, or the owner has not obtained a valid building permit. An extension of these time limitations may be granted without a public hearing by the Common Council by resolution reauthorizing the conditional Use in accordance with the following criteria:

A. The applicant requesting the extension shall complete a planning application and shall submit a \$250.00 extension fee.

B. A written explanation for the extension of time shall accompany the planning application along with a timeline/schedule for obtaining necessary permits, zoning, state and municipal approvals and a target date for construction start;

C. The request for extension shall be submitted within 60 days of the expiration of the conditional Use permit;

D. The extension, if granted, shall be valid for a period of 6 months. If no building permit has been issued and construction has not commenced within 6 months from and after the extension has been granted, the conditional Use shall become null and void.

9. Miscellaneous.

A. Applicants are advised that the foregoing conditions are reasonably necessary to protect the public interest and to secure compliance with the standards and requirements specified in Sec. 19.14 of the Revised Municipal Code; that the issuance of the conditional Use is expressly subject to compliance with said conditions.

B. The use, as granted herein, is subject to applicants' compliance with all other state and local laws and regulations which may be applicable to the proposed use of the real estate in question.

C. The conditional use, as granted herein, shall run with the land and benefit and restrict all future owners and occupants of the property, unless the use shall lapse or be terminated and the use will not be altered or extended (including structural alterations and/or additions) without the approval of the Common Council, following public hearing, all as provided in Sec. 19.14 of the Revised Municipal Code.

10. Lapse. If the applicant does not meet all of the terms and conditions set forth in this grant of a conditional use within one year of the granting thereof, then the conditional use permit shall lapse and become null and void and the applicant shall forfeit any right to use the property as conferred by the conditional use permit. The failure of the applicant to meet the terms and conditions of the conditional use permit shall subject the permit to being declared void by the Common Council after notice to the applicant and a hearing before the Economic Development Committee. Upon a finding and recommendation by the Committee to the Common Council on the matter, the applicant and/or any interested person may make comments regarding the matter to the Common Council prior to the Common Council's next

regular meeting following the recommendation. Upon the Common Council's finding that the conditional use permit has lapsed and become void, the applicant shall cease all operations at the property.

11. Termination of conditional Use. If the person or entity granted the conditional use violates, allows, or suffers the violation of the ordinances of the City of West Allis, the State of Wisconsin or the United States on the premises covered by the conditional Use, then the conditional use may be terminated.

12. Acknowledgement. That the applicants sign an acknowledgment that he has received these terms and conditions and will abide by them.

The undersigned applicant agrees to the terms and conditions and has agreed that the grant of the conditional use permit is conditioned on meeting the terms and conditions of this resolution.

2. Building Plans, Fire Codes and Licensing. The grant of this conditional use is subject to building plans, code being submitted to and approved by the Code Enforcement and Fire Departments. A State of WI/DHS Licensed facility.

3. Signage. Signage shall be permitted in compliance with the West Allis signage ordinance.

4. Operations. The Community Living Arrangement will serve 16 persons.

5. Deliveries and Refuse Collection. All refuse to be provided by a commercial hauler. All refuse, recyclables and other waste material shall be located indoors and/or screened from view within a 4-sided enclosure or as approved by the Planning & Zoning office to match the building. All tenants of the property will be required to abide by the City of West Allis health/public nuisance rules per Chapter 7 of the Revised Municipal Code.

6. Outdoor Lighting. All exterior lighting fixtures and/or lighting visible from public right-ofway shall be indirect and shielded in such a manner that no light splays from the property boundaries. Lighting is subject to a photometric lighting plan being approved by the Plan Commission.

7. Expiration of conditional use permit. Any conditional Use approved by the Common Council shall lapse and become null and void 1 year from and after that approval if the use has not commenced, construction is not underway, or the owner has not obtained a valid building permit. An extension of these time limitations may be granted without a public hearing by the Common Council by resolution reauthorizing the conditional Use in accordance with the following criteria:

A. The applicant requesting the extension shall complete a planning application and shall

submit a \$250.00 extension fee.

B. A written explanation for the extension of time shall accompany the planning application along with a timeline/schedule for obtaining necessary permits, zoning, state and municipal approvals and a target date for construction start;

C. The request for extension shall be submitted within 60 days of the expiration of the conditional Use permit;

D. The extension, if granted, shall be valid for a period of 6 months. If no building permit has been issued and construction has not commenced within 6 months from and after the extension has been granted, the conditional Use shall become null and void.

8. Miscellaneous.

A. Applicants are advised that the foregoing conditions are reasonably necessary to protect the public interest and to secure compliance with the standards and requirements specified in Sec. 19.14 of the Revised Municipal Code; that the issuance of the conditional Use is expressly subject to compliance with said conditions.

B. The use, as granted herein, is subject to applicants' compliance with all other state and local laws and regulations which may be applicable to the proposed use of the real estate in question.

C. The conditional use, as granted herein, shall run with the land and benefit and restrict all future owners and occupants of the property, unless the use shall lapse or be terminated and the use will not be altered or extended (including structural alterations and/or additions) without the approval of the Common Council, following public hearing, all as provided in Sec. 19.14 of the Revised Municipal Code.

9. Lapse. If the applicant does not meet all of the terms and conditions set forth in this grant of a conditional use within one year of the granting thereof, then the conditional use permit shall lapse and become null, and void and the applicant shall forfeit any right to use the property as conferred by the conditional use permit. The failure of the applicant to meet the terms and conditions of the conditional use permit shall subject the permit to being declared void by the Common Council after notice to the applicant and a hearing before the Economic Development Committee. Upon a finding and recommendation by the Committee to the Common Council on the matter, the applicant and/or any interested person may make comments regarding the matter to the Common Council prior to the Common Council's finding that the conditional use permit has lapsed and become void, the applicant shall cease all operations at the property.

10. Termination of conditional Use. If the person or entity granted the conditional use violates, allows, or suffers the violation of the ordinances of the City of West Allis, the State of

Wisconsin or the United States on the premises covered by the conditional Use, then the conditional use may be terminated.

11. Acknowledgement. That the applicants sign an acknowledgment that he has received these terms and conditions and will abide by them.

The undersigned applicant agrees to the terms and conditions and has agreed that the grant of the conditional use permit is conditioned on meeting the terms and conditions of this resolution.

Detective Brandon Hurley of the West Allis Police Department, being duly sworn on oath, deposes and states as a complaint under Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag) against CRG Investments LLC doing business as "Limanski's Pub" as follows:

- 1. That the complainant is a resident of the City of West Allis.
- 2. That this complaint is based upon information contained within official records maintained by the City of West Allis and the City of West Allis Police Department that the complainant has used in the past and found to be reliable.
- 3. That CRG Investments LLC does business as "Limanski's Pub" and currently holds a "Class B" intoxicating liquor license and a Class "B" fermented malt beverage license (together identified on the license as a "Class B Tavern License"), and a Public Entertainment Permit, all issued under license number ALC-22-148, for the

premises located at 8900 W. Greenfield Avenue in the City of West Allis, State of Wisconsin, for the license period running July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023.

- That Kathy Goedde is the agent appointed pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 125.04(6)(a) for license number ALC-22-148.
- 5. That the premises has held a "Class B" intoxicating liquor license and a Class "B" fermented malt beverage license for several years, with the prior license being issued under license number 2021-072 for the license period running July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022.
- 6. That on or about June 22, 2022, police were dispatched to Limanski's Pub located at 8900 W. Greenfield Avenue for a large fight in progress. Police arrived on the scene and observed a large group of people outside the bar. Officers were able to determine that there was a verbal disagreement between two groups that originated inside the bar before that altercation moved outside the bar and into the community. Police were able to determine that one group associated with the fight remained outside the bar while another party involved in the fight had been moved by bar staff to the basement of the bar.

Officer Lonnie Christianson made contact with Dale W. who was one of the parties identified as being involved in the fight and was still outside the bar. Officer Christianson identified that Dale W. was "very intoxicated," was profane, loud, and disorderly while outside the bar and in her contact with him.

Officers were notified that the other party involved in the fight may have pointed a gun at Dale W. Based on the nature of the call for service, police ordered the subject in the basement to exit the building and made contact with a subject, Michael R.

Body camera footage shows Limanski's Pub staff exiting the basement just before Michael R. comes out. Police conducted a consent search of the basement of the bar and found a firearm hidden in a freezer door by the stairs and a black bag with a label of "cookies" that contained approximately 195 grams of marijuana, 5.13 grams of methamphetamine, and 7.55 grams of cocaine. Police investigation revealed that the gun and drugs were taken to the basement by Michael R. in this incident.

Police recovered surveillance video showing a portion of the basement of the bar. That video depicts at least one male employee, believed to be Michael N., of Limanski's Pub present in the basement with Michael R. as he makes attempts to conceal gun and drugs. This male employee can be seen entering and exiting the video and is also the same male employee that police see exit the basement ahead of Michael R.

- 7. That on August 14, 2022, at approximately 12:45 AM, police were dispatched to Limanski's Pub for a physical fight outside the bar. Police identified that a bar patron identified as Nicole K., was outside smoking a cigarette with her fiancé when two unknown parties pushed her and her fiancé. Police Officer Aric Behnke had contact with the bartender on duty, Michael N. who reported that he was not aware of any problems. Michael N. is the same employee observed in the basement during the June 22, 2022 incident.
- 8. That on September 9, 2022, police were dispatched to Limanski's Pub for a battery complaint. Police made contact with Brian D. who reported the assault at the bar. Officer laquinta reported that he made contact with Brian D., who was apparently highly intoxicated. Officer laquinta made contact with bartender Michael N. who

stated that there was only a verbal altercation with the patrons. This Michael N. is the same employee seen in the basement on June 22, 2022, and referenced in the August 14th, 2022 altercation.

- 9. That on October 9, 2022, at approximately 3:30 AM, police were dispatched to Limanski's Pub for a report of an assault. Police determined that a male party had been assaulted outside the bar and a gold necklace was removed from his neck. There were no known suspects. When police arrived on scene just after 3:30 AM, they determined that there were still patrons inside Limanski's Pub. One citation was issued to Michael N. (same bartender identified in all prior incidents) for allowing patrons to remain on the premises after closing.
- 10. That later that same day on October 9, 2022, at approximately 8:22 PM, police responded to Limanski's Pub for a large fight inside the business. Officer Stelter obtained information that the fight seemed to originate within the bar before spilling out into the community. One community member with initials A.S. identified that she was watching tv at home when the fight exited the bar into the streets. She said some of the bar patrons entered her yard and continued fighting. One patron removed one of the rocks in her yard and attempted to throw it or use it as a weapon.

Officer Stelter had contact with bar owner Kathy Goedde regarding the incident. Police requested to view the bar's surveillance video, but Ms. Goedde stated it would take an hour to download the interior video. As of October 10, police did not get a return phone call that the footage was available.

- 11. That on October 23, 2022, police were dispatched to Limanski's Pub for a report of multiple assaults. Police determined that a subject by the name of Cassandra D. had assaulted two bar employees. Cassandra D. was identified as being highly intoxicated by bar staff, but she had fled prior to police arriving. Cassandra D. was issued multiple citations and a warrant was issued for her with probation and parole.
- 12. That pursuant to Wis. Stat. §125.12(2) any license issued under Wis. Stat. Ch. 125 is subject to suspension or revocation for any of the following:
 - A. Violating Wis. Stat. § 125.07(2)(a)(2), per Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)1. for serving persons who are intoxicated;
 - B. Keeping or maintaining a disorderly or riotous, indecent or improper house in violation of Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)2.; and
 - C. Knowingly allowing another person or employee on the premises who possesses with the intent to distribute or deliver a controlled substance or controlled substance analog in violation of Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)6.
- 13. That pursuant to West Allis Municipal Code §§ 9.51b. and 9.51d. the Public Entertainment Permit is subject to suspension or revocation when the operator has failed to maintain order on the premises and has caused a public nuisance at the property, demonstrated by the bar staff allowing individuals to hide drugs and gun, serving patrons past the point of intoxication, and maintaining a bar that is continually the catalyst for fights and violent behavior spilling out into the community.

WHEREFORE, Detective Brandon Hurley requests that the licensees named herein, CRG Investments LLC, be summoned to appear before the License and Health Committee of the West Allis Common Council to answer this complaint and, if the material allegations of the complaint are denied, that a hearing be held to determine whether the licenses and permits issued to CRG Investments LLC, should be revoked or suspended.

- **C.** Bouncer and/or bartender to ensure than NO individuals entering the bar are already intoxicated; also responsible to monitor customers' intoxication while at the bar (assessing patron intoxication levels, drink counting by bartenders, etc.). Licenses

- I. You MUST have a valid ID and your bartenders license on your person or in the bar at all times.
- **II.** Customers must have a valid ID on their person as well. You can receive a ticket if your bud is there with no ID, even though you know they are of legal age.
- **III.** Royal Sovereign scanner should be used (black light to identify alterations, white light to fully illuminate, magnifier to increase readability of text)
- **IV.** When the bouncer is present it is their duty to provide security, to check legal age and drinking age, to refuse entry for intoxicated persons (but if necessary, provide assistance and arrange rides home).
- V. It is still the responsibility of the bartender to confirm patrons are of legal age

Greenfield Avenue in the City of West Allis, Wisconsin, for the period running July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND RECOMMENDATION

- That Kathy Goedde is the agent appointed pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 125.04(6)(a) for license ALC-22-148.
- 3. That CRG Investments LLC, doing business as "Limanski's Pub" with licensing agent Kathy Goedde, also held a "Class B Tavern License" under license number 2021-072 for the license period running from July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022.
- 4. That on or about November 9, 2022, CRG Investments LLC was served with a copy of the summons and complaint in this matter.
- That on or about November 15, 2022, CRG Investments LLC by agent Kathy Goedde, denied the material allegations in the complaint and the matter was set for a hearing.
- 6. That on December 19, 2022, CRG Investments LLC appeared by their attorney, Brian Randall. The West Allis License and Health Committee held an evidentiary hearing regarding the complaint. The Committee heard testimony from Kathy Goedde, Ed Jones, Officer Schrandt, Officer Christianson, Officer Behnke, Officer laquinta, and Officer Kossow related to the allegations in the complaint.
- That on December 28, 2022, the West Allis License and Health Committee reconvened with committee members: Alderperson Grisham, Alderperson Reinke, Alderperson Roadt, and Alderperson Stefanski, to deliberate regarding the testimony and evidence presented on December 19th.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. That CRG Investments LLC was properly served at least three (3) days before the time at which the licensee was commanded to appear and service was

accomplished in a manner provided under Wis. Stat. Ch. 801 for service in civil actions in circuit court.

- 2. That based upon the reliable video evidence, credible testimony, and paper exhibits presented to the Committee by the parties, the West Allis License and Health Committee found that the allegations in the complaint are substantially true and that:
 - a. CRG Investments LLC did violate Wis. Stat. § 125.07(2)(a)(2) for serving persons who are intoxicated; and,
 - b. CRG Investments LLC did violate Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)2 for keeping or maintaining a disorderly or riotous, indecent or improper house; and,
 - c. CRG Investments LLC did violate Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)6 for knowingly allowing another person, who is on the premises for which the license under this chapter is issued, to possess, with the intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, or to manufacture, distribute, or deliver a controlled substance or controlled substance analog.
- That this conclusion by the Committee forms a sufficient basis pursuant to Wis. Stat. 125.12(b)2 to either suspend for no less than 10 days nor more than 90 days or revoke the licenses under ALC-22-148.

RECOMMENDATION

Therefore, the License and Health Committee recommends to the Common Council of the City of West Allis that the 2022-2023 "Class B" intoxicating liquor license and a Class "B" fermented malt beverage license (together referred to as the "Class B Tavern License") and a public entertainment license, collectively held under license number ALC-22-148 be suspended for ten (10) days per violation, consecutive to each violation, for a total suspension of 30 days. This suspension shall begin at 12:01 A.M. on January 16th, 2023, and shall end at 11:59 PM on February 14, 2023.

Further, it is the recommendation of this Committee that the premises be closed for business during this suspension and not allow patrons within the business for any purpose during the suspension period.

Detective Brandon Hurley of the West Allis Police Department, being duly sworn on oath, deposes and states as a complaint under Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag) against EKC Investments LLC and doing business as "Kane's Bar & Grill" as follows:

- 1. That the complainant is a resident of the City of West Allis.
- 2. That this complaint is based upon information contained within official records maintained by the City of West Allis and the City of West Allis Police Department that the complainant has used in the past and found to be reliable.
- 3. That EKC Investments LLC, doing business as "Kane's Bar & Grill" has been issued a "Class B" intoxicating liquor license and a Class "B" fermented malt beverage license (together identified on the license as a "Class B Tavern License"), and a Public Entertainment Permit, all issued under license number ALC-22-1, for the premises

located at 6922 W. Orchard Street in the City of West Allis, State of Wisconsin, for the license period running July 1, 2022, and expiring on June 30, 2023.

- That Ed Jones is the agent appointed pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 125.04(6)(a) for license number ALC-22-1. Kathy Goedde is identified as a vice president of EKC Investments LLC.
- 5. That EKC Investments LLC first obtained a Class B Tavern and Public Entertainment license for the premises located at 6922 W. Orchard Street on February 9, 2022. This license ran from February until the end of the license period on June 30, 2022. At that time the 2022-2023 license period began under ALC-22-1. Ed Jones was the agent for that license as well.
- 6. That on July 2, 2022, officers were dispatched to Kane's Bar & Grill at 6922 W. Orchard Street regarding a potential overdose. Officer Roth arrived on scene and made contact with individuals at the bar. Officer Roth observed that a bar employee identified as Kathy G. had overdosed and was on the ground near the bar. The West Allis Fire Department began to render aid. The West Allis Fire Department administered Narcan, a substance used in emergency situations to help reverse the effects of an opioid overdose, which was effective and Kathy G. became responsive. Kathy G. denied taking any illegal substance, despite Officer Schrandt explaining that Narcan only works to counteract opiates.

Officer Roth identified a second employee, Chad H., that appeared to be under the influence of some type of drug. Chad H. originally told officer Roth that Kathy G. had gone outside with an unknown male before the overdose event occurred. Chad H. was confronted about his impairment. He stated that he did not use drugs with his

boss, Kathy G. Chad H. also admitted that he had some "leftover" cocaine on his person. The substance found on his person was described as a white chunky substance, weight of approximately .94 grams. Sergeant Clint Corwin tested that substance using the Nark II (07) Scott Reagent Modified Field Test. The substance tested positive as cocaine base (cocaine).

Two other employees on scene, M.N. and K.P. advised that approximately 15 minutes before the overdose event, they observed Chad H. and Kathy G. go outside for a smoke break. The two remained outside for a period of time and upon returning inside the bar, both were sweating profusely and Kathy G. began to show signs of overdosing.

- 7. That the above incident occurred exactly ten (10) days after an incident involving the recovery of a firearm and a substantial quantity of drugs, including cocaine, was found in the basement of Limanski's Pub, another bar that is owned and managed by Kathy Goedde.
- 8. That police have had other contacts at the property since EKC Investments LLC began to utilize the alcohol license for the premises.
 - A. On March 13, 2022, police conducted a tavern check of the premises and identified that the tavern license was not on display as required by Wis. Stat. 125.04(10)(b).
 - B. Police were also dispatched to the location multiple times between March 26, 2022, through September 24, 2022, for noise complaints and other disturbances from employees or former employees. Those complaints were as follows:

- i. March 26, 2022- Noise complaint identified by a 3rd party. Police were not able to confirm the noise violation and no action was taken by police at that time.
- May 15, 2022- Noise complaint identified by a 3rd party. Police went to the scene and observed the violation. Police asked employees to close the doors.
- iii. May 20, 2022- Noise complaint identified by 3rd party. Police were not able to independently confirm so no action taken by police.
- iv. May 26, 2022- Noise complaint observed although determined not to be loud enough to cause a disturbance at the time officer arrived.
 Employee stated that someone had the door open briefly but they will continue to keep door closed to avoid issue in future.
- v. September 3, 2022- Noise complaint identified by a 3rd party regarding loud music. Police dispatched but could not independently confirm. No action taken by police at that time.
- vi. September 18, 2022- Current employees contacted police about a former employee, Cassie, banging on the back door and scaring current employees. After the initial call, police were unable to make contact with any individuals involved.
- vii. September 24, 2022- Noise complaint regarding loud music and the doors of the bar being open. Police attempted to contact the bar via telephone but there was no answer. The owner of the bar was contacted and indicated he would handle the matter.

- 9. That pursuant to Wis. Stat. §125.12(2) any license issued under Wis. Stat. Ch. 125 is subject to suspension or revocation for any of the following:
 - A. Violating Wis. Stat. § 125.04(10)(b), per Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)1. for failure to display the license;
 - B. Keeping or maintaining a disorderly or riotous, indecent or improper house in violation of Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)2.; and
 - C. Knowingly allowing another person or employee on the premises who possesses with the intent to distribute or deliver a controlled substance or controlled substance analog in violation of Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(ag)6.
- 10. That pursuant to West Allis Municipal Code §§ 9.51b. and 9.51d. the Public Entertainment Permit is subject to suspension or revocation when the operator has failed to maintain order on the premises and has caused a public nuisance at the property, demonstrated by the noise complaints and more pressingly by employees using and sharing controlled substances at the premises.

WHEREFORE, Detective Brandon Hurley requests that the licensees named herein, EKC Investments LLC, be summoned to appear before the License and Health Committee of the West Allis Common Council to answer this complaint and, if the material allegations of the complaint are denied, that a hearing be held to determine whether the licenses and permits issued to EKC Investments LLC, should be revoked or suspended.

Security & Operations Update

- A. Bouncer at door on Fridays (7 pm Close), Saturdays (7 pm Close), and Sundays (9pm – Close).
- **B.** Security cameras to be added at the front (along Greenfield Ave.), on the side pointed to the south, and in the rear parking lot.
- **C.** Bouncer and/or bartender to ensure than NO individuals entering the bar are already intoxicated; also responsible to monitor customers' intoxication while at the bar (assessing patron intoxication levels, drink counting by bartenders, etc.). Upon hiring, owner/General Manager to conduct training for identifying and monitoring intoxicated individuals and for arranging rides home where necessary. Quarterly review with all staff for same by owner/General Manager.
- **D.** Maintain the posted "No Firearms or Weapons" and "No Drug Activity" signs at the site (**attached**). Additional signs will be posted.
- E. Post list of prohibited individuals in location(s) visible to employees. Quarterly review with all staff of listed individuals by owner/General Manager to identify any patterns of conduct, additional individuals of concern, or appropriate follow up (with Police Department, area businesses, etc.).

Licenses

- I. You MUST have a valid ID and your bartenders license on your person or in the bar at all times.
- **II.** Customers must have a valid ID on their person as well. You can receive a ticket if your bud is there with no ID, even though you know they are of legal age.
- **III.** Royal Sovereign scanner should be used (black light to identify alterations, white light to fully illuminate, magnifier to increase readability of text)
- **IV.** When the bouncer is present it is their duty to provide security, to check legal age and drinking age, to refuse entry for intoxicated persons (but if necessary, provide assistance and arrange rides home).
- V. It is still the responsibility of the bartender to confirm patrons are of legal age

Failure to follow these procedures may lead to termination.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That EKC Investments LLC, doing business as "Kane's Bar & Grill" has been issued a "Class B" intoxicating liquor license and a Class "B" fermented malt beverage license (together identified on the license as a "Class B Tavern License"), and a Public Entertainment Permit, all issued under license number ALC-22-1, for the premises located at 6922 W. Orchard Street in the City of West Allis, State of Wisconsin, for the license period running July 1, 2022, and expiring on June 30, 2023.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND RECOMMENDATION

- That Ed Jones is the agent appointed pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 125.04(6)(a) for license number ALC-22-1.
- 3. That on or about November 9, 2022, EKC Investments LLC was served with a copy of the summons and complaint in this matter.
- 4. That on or about November 15, 2022, EKC Investments LLC by agent Ed Jones, denied the material allegations in the complaint and the matter was set for a hearing.
- 5. That on December 19, 2022, EKC Investments LLC appeared by their attorney, Brian Randall. The West Allis License and Health Committee held an evidentiary hearing regarding the complaint. The committee heard testimony from Ed Jones, Kathy Goedde, Officer Schrandt, and Seargent Schmidt regarding the allegations in the complaint.
- That on December 28, 2022, the West Allis License and Health Committee reconvened with committee members: Alderperson Grisham, Alderperson Reinke, Alderperson Roadt, and Alderperson Stefanski, to deliberate regarding the testimony and evidence presented on December 19th.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- That EKC Investment s LLC was properly served at least three (3) days before the time at which the licensee was commanded to appear and service was accomplished in a manner provided under Wis. Stat. Ch. 801 for service in civil actions in circuit court.
- 2. That based upon the evidence presented, including testimony of the licensee and police officers, and the recommendation of both the city prosecutor and attorney for

EKC Investments LLC, the License and Health Committee finds the allegations in the complaint related to the licensee's culpability to be untrue.

RECOMMENDATION

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 125.12(2)(b)5, the committee recommends that the council dismiss the complaint without costs to the accused. Although no discipline is recommended at this time, the licensee is notified that:

- any and all drug activity at the property will be addressed with new enforcement actions;
- b. the licensee should continue work to abate noise complaint issues; and
- c. The licensee should find solutions to issues in compliance with other local, state, and federal regulations.

RESOLUTION FOR A GRANT APPLICATION FOR UP TO \$50,000 FROM THE WISCONSIN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT INVESTMENT VIBRANT SPACES GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE PROPOSED PEDESTRIAN PLAZA TO BE LOCATED WITHIN DOWNTOWN WEST ALLIS, ON S. 72 ST., IMMEDIATELY NORTH OF W. GREENFIELD AVE

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation Community Development Investment Vibrant Spaces Grant (CDI-VS Grant) requires each applicant to provide a signed resolution by the governing elected body authorizing the submittal of an application to the CDI-VS Grant Program; and,

WHEREAS, the application must come from the municipality, and only one application per municipality will be considered; and,

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2022 The Common Council of the City of West Allis approved Ordinance O-2022-0170 to create a pedestrian mall in the 1300 block of 72nd St.; and,

WHEREAS, on December 13, 2022 The Common Council of the City of West Allis approved R-2022-0873 to approve a privilege agreement between The City of West Allis and Walter Holtz of The Deco at 7140 W. Greenfield Ave. for use of a designated portion of S. 72 St. as a pedestrian mall; and,

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation (WEDC) has a Community Development Investment-Vibrant Spaces Grant (CDI-VS) that provides up to \$50,000 to assist with creating vibrant and engaging communities that make it easier to recruit and retain residents, sustain a robust labor force and enhance local quality of life; and,

WHEREAS, the City of West Allis has collaborated with Walter Holtz of The Deco to apply for this CDI-VS Grant to enhance the creation of the Pedestrian Plaza to be located within Downtown West Allis; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Holtz would be required to match the CDI grant amount awarded (if so awarded); and,

WHEREAS, the conversion of right of way into a Pedestrian Plaza, near the center of Downtown West Allis will create a visible and pedestrian oriented space, will attract multiple user groups, will impact the community district and nearby businesses and this grant would enhance the quality of the plans: and,

WHEREAS, the project has received demonstrated support from the community; and,

WHEREAS, the project is scheduled to start in April of 2023.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Common Council of the City of West Allis supports a joint application for a WEDC Community Development Investment Vibrant Spaces Grant of up to \$50,000 to support the proposed Pedestrian Plaza to be located within Downtown West Allis, on S. 72 St., immediately north of W. Greenfield Ave., and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Economic Development Executive Director or his designee is authorized to implement the Program and execute funding agreements.

CITY OF WEST ALLIS ORDINANCE O-2023-0001

ORDINANCE UPDATING RULES AND PROCESS RELATED TO PARK RENTAL PERMIT AND ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION IN PUBLIC PLACES

AMENDING SECTIONS 6.03(8) AND 11.13; RENUMBERING SECTION 6.09

WHEREAS, the common council desires to streamline the park permitting process and update language related to alcohol consumption in public places;

NOW THEREFORE, the common council of the City of West Allis do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: <u>AMENDMENT</u> "6.03 Public Welfare And Peace" of the City Of West Allis Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

AMENDMENT

6.03 Public Welfare And Peace

- 1. Destruction of Property.
 - a. Fences, Walls, Trees, etc. No person shall willfully, maliciously or wantonly destroy, remove, throw down or injure any fence, hedge or wall enclosing any orchard, garden or any field whatever on land belonging to or lawfully occupied by another, or to open or leave open, throw down, injure, remove or destroy any gate or bars in such fence, hedge or wall, or cut down, root up, sever, injure, destroy or carry away, when severed, any fruit, shade, ornamental or other tree or any shrub, root, plant, fruit, flower, grain or other vegetable production in the City.
 - b. Park Property, Statues, etc. No person shall break or otherwise injure any tree, shrub or plant; break, soil or deface any fountain, statue or other ornamental structure; damage any grass plot; or, in any way, injure, soil or deface any square, sidewalk or ground in the City or any public property in any public park or any other public place, which has been declared to be a public park and under the control of the City, whether the same shall be owned, leased or held in trust by the City, or held in trust for the use of the City.
 - c. Gardens, Crops, etc. No person shall enter any enclosed or unenclosed garden or orchard located within the City, without the consent of the owner, tenant, lessee or his or her agent and there cut down, injure, damage, destroy, pull out, eat or carry away any portion of the garden, including any growing thing, crop, seed, soil, fertilizer, water supply, tools, implements, racks, support or any other protective device or any other thing useful for the development, cultivation, maintenance and use of the garden.

- Posting Signs, Advertisements or Displays. No person shall put up, erect, fasten, post, paint or maintain any sign, picture, poster, advertisement, symbol, structure, display or any other item of any description upon any curb, sidewalk, fence, board, barrel, box, case, railing, pole, post, barricade, material, bridge, structure or building of any kind placed upon any street, alley, public way or public ground. [Ord. O-2008-0003, 2/5/2008]
- 3. Open Air Meetings.
 - a. Where Prohibited. No person shall hold any open air meetings for any purpose whatsoever on West Greenfield Avenue between South 69th Street and South 76th Street or on any side street or in any alley abutting thereon, within one hundred twenty (120) feet on either side of West Greenfield Avenue.
 - b. Permit Required. Any person properly qualified may secure a permit for use of the park located at South 70th Street and West National Avenue for such purpose, providing permission is first obtained from the Park Board of the City.
- 4. Disorderly Conduct with a Motor Vehicle.
 - a. No person shall, within the City of West Allis, on public or private property, by or through the use of a motor vehicle, motorcycle, snowmobile, minibike, all-terrain vehicle or any other motorized vehicle, engage in violent, dangerous, abusive, unreasonably loud or otherwise disorderly conduct, including but not limited to unnecessary, deliberate or intentional: spinning of wheels, squealing of tires, revving of the engine, blowing of the horn, causing the engine to backfire, causing the vehicle in motion to raise one or more of its wheels off the ground or causing the vehicle to otherwise be operated in an erratic or dangerous manner under circumstances which tend to cause or provoke a disturbance.
 - b. Any person who shall violate this subsection shall upon conviction be subject to a forfeiture in the amount of \$300.00 for each offense.
- 5. Diseased and Infected Trees, Hedges, etc.
 - a. Inspection by Superintendent of Forestry and Public Grounds; Notice; Removal. The Superintendent of Forestry and Public Grounds (hereafter "the Superintendent") may inspect trees, vines, hedges, plants, logs and branches within the City right-of-way and those trees, vines, hedges, plants, logs, and branches as the Superintendent determines may pose a danger to persons using the City right-of-way in order to determine whether they are healthy or diseased. If any such tree, vine, hedge, plant, log or branch is found dead, diseased, infected or infested and, in the opinion of the Superintendent, is likely to spread any disease or is found to harbor destructive insects or, if any tree, vine, hedge, plant, log or branch is dangerous to the public, the Superintendent shall give a written order to the owner, agent or occupant of such premises of such condition and direct that the owner, agent or occupant to remove and destroy the tree, vine, hedge, plant, log or branch. The owner, agent, or occupant of such premises of such condition will have thirty (30)

days from the date of the order to correct the defect. The owner, agent, or occupant may request an extension to correct the defects which will only be granted for good cause at the discretion of the Superintendent of Forestry and Public Grounds. The owner, agent, or occupant who received the order may appeal the order to the Administrative Appeals Review Board (hereafter "the Board") by submitting a written objection to the City Clerk's Office within 30 days of the order. Upon receipt of a timely appeal, the Board shall hold a hearing on the appeal, during which the Board may review any pertinent information and may accept oral and written statements from any person. In the event the owner, agent or occupant shall fail to comply with the orders within the time specified, the Superintendent may enter upon and remove or contract for the removal of the diseased, infected or infested trees, vines, hedges, plants, logs or branches or any part thereof.

- b. Transportation Permit Required. No person, firm or corporation shall carry or transport in, out of or through the City, any dead, diseased, infected or infested trees, vines, hedges, plants, logs and branches. All commercial and professional arborists shall, upon removal of any dead, diseased, infected or infested trees, vines, hedges, plants, logs and branches, get a permit from the Superintendent to carry or transport the same to an approved and designated disposal area, as directed by the Superintendent.
- c. Sale and Planting of Cottonwood Trees Prohibited. No person shall hereafter sell or plant within the City any populus sargentii, commonly known as the plains cottonwood, or the populus deltoides, commonly known as the eastern cottonwood, both such species also commonly known as the cottonwood poplar.
- 6. Fraud on Tavern Keeper.
 - a. No person, having obtained food, lodging, beverage or other service at a tavern, shall intentionally abscond without paying for it; nor, while a patron at a tavern, shall intentionally defraud the keeper thereof in any transaction arising out of such relationship.
 - b. Under this subsection, prima facie evidence of any intent to defraud or to abscond is shown by:

The refusal of payment upon presentation when due and the return unpaid of any bank check or order for the payment of money given by any patron to any tavern in payment of any obligation arising out of such relationship as patron; or,

The failure or refusal of any patron at a tavern to pay, upon written demand, the established charge for food, beverages of any kind or other services actually rendered; or,

The giving of false information or the presenting of false or fictitious credentials for the purpose of obtaining credit, food, beverages or other services; or,

The drawing, endorsing, issuing or delivering to any tavern of any check, draft or order for payment of money upon any bank or other depository, in payment of established charges for food, beverages of any kind or other service, knowing at the time that there is not sufficient credit with the drawee bank or other depository for payment in full of the instrument drawn.

- 7. Consumption and Possession of <u>Alcohol</u>Fermented Malt Beverages and Intoxicating Liquors.
 - a. No person shall consume any fermented malt beverage or intoxicating liquor in or may consume alcohol beverages or possess alcohol beverages in an open container while upon any public way street, alley, sidewalk, or City-owned property. This provision does not apply to any of the following: park or other public place
 - i. Any premises where a City-issued license or permit allows the consumption of alcohol
 - ii. Within a community event declared under this subsection if the alcohol beverage was lawfully obtained at the community event or a licensee adjacent to the community event
 - iii. At the farmers market if the alcohol beverage was lawfully obtained at the farmers market
 - iv. The consumption of fermented malt beverages on a commercial quadricycle.
 - b. No person shall have in his possession any fermented malt beverage or intoxicating liquor in or upon any public street, alley, sidewalk, park or other public place, unless such beverage or liquor is in the unopened original container or sealed original package(<u>Reserved</u>).
 - c. No person shall drink from or open a container of fermented malt beverage or intoxicating liquor in a motor vehicle, which is parked or standing upon a public street, alley, municipal parking lot or other public place(Reserved).
 - d. The holder of a Class "B" fermented malt beverage or intoxicating liquor license shall make every reasonable effort to discourage his patrons from taking fermented malt beverages or intoxicating liquor from the licensed premises, when such beverages or liquor are served for consumption on the premises, unless the patron is directly entering a community event as described in par. (c)No person licensed or permitted to sell alcohol beverages may knowingly allow another person to leave that licensed or permitted premises while carrying an alcohol beverage in an open container, except to enter a community event adjacent to the premises. No person may leave a premises licensed or permitted to sell alcohol beverages while carrying an alcohol beverage in an open container, except to enter a djacent to the premises.
 - e. The Common Council may, by resolution, designate a specified public way or <u>city-owned property gathering</u> to be <u>the location of a community event</u>. during which event, the prohibitions The resolution shall describe the premises of the <u>community event</u>, the date and time of the community event, and any other

<u>conditions upon the consumption of alcohol beverages on the premises of that</u> <u>community eventset forth in this section shall not apply at the location and the</u> <u>date(s) and time specified in the resolution. The resolution shall identify the</u> <u>designated community event and shall set forth the date or dates, time, and</u> <u>geographic location in which the prohibitions set forth in this section shall not</u> <u>apply</u>.

- f. No person may possess alcohol beverages within a community event unless that person may lawfully sell that alcohol beverage or that person obtained the alcohol beverage from a person who may lawfully sell that alcohol beverage at the community event(Reserved).
- 8. Fireworks Prohibited.
 - a. Definition. In this section, "fireworks" means anything manufactured, processed or packaged for exploding, emitting sparks or combustion, which does not have another common use, but does not include any of the following:
 - i. Fuel or lubricants.
 - ii. A firearm cartridge or shotgun shell.
 - iii. A flare used or possessed or sold for use as a signal in an emergency or in the operation of a railway, aircraft, watercraft or motor vehicle.
 - iv. A match, cigarette lighter, stove, furnace, candle, lantern or space heater.
 - v. A cap containing not more than one quarter (1/4) gram of explosive mixture, if the cap is used or possessed or sold for use, in a device which prevents direct bodily contact with the cap when it is in place for explosion.
 - vi. A model rocket engine.
 - vii. Tobacco or a tobacco product.
 - b. Prohibition.
 - i. No person may sell any fireworks in the City of West Allis.
 - ii. Exceptions. This section does not prohibit a resident, wholesaler, dealer or jobber from selling fireworks at wholesale, if that wholesaler, dealer or jobber ships or delivers the fireworks outside of this state in sealed opaque containers by, as defined in secs. 194.01(5), (11) and (14) of the Wisconsin Statutes, common motor carrier, contract motor carrier or private motor carrier engaged in the business of shipping or delivering property, or to a person or group granted a permit under sec. 167.10 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
 - c. Possession and Use, State Statutes Adopted. Possession and use of fireworks shall be regulated according to the provisions of sec. 167.10 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as the same are from time to time amended, which are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference herein.
 - d. Enforcement.
 - i. In addition to other penalties prescribed under this section, the City may petition the Circuit Court for an order enjoining any violation of this ordinance or of sec. 167.10 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

ii. Any fireworks stored, handled, sold, possessed or used by the person who violates any provision of this section shall be seized. The fireworks shall be destroyed after conviction for a violation and otherwise returned to the owner.

e. Penalties.

i. Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, pay a forfeiture of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500), together with the costs of the action and, upon default of payment thereof, shall be imprisoned in the Milwaukee County House of Correction for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days or until such forfeiture and costs are paid. Each day during which a violation of this section is permitted to exist shall be deemed to be a separate violation.

Parks and parklands shall include all lands currently owned by the City of West Allis that are designated as parks, pocket parks, green spaces or boulevards. Also included in the definition is the terrace area between the curb and sidewalk or, in the absence of a sidewalk, the curb and property line of every street and highway within the City. The following are designated as parks: **[Ord. O-2016-0052, 11/15/2016]** Farmer's Market [the Farmer's Market shall be governed pursuant to Section 2.25(3)(b) of the Revised Municipal Code.]Veterans Memorial Park (South 70 Street and West National Avenue). Washington Playground (South 61 Street and West Lapham Street). Kopperud Park (South 76 Street and West Pierce Street). Veterans Housing Park (West Harrison Avenue and South 72 Street). Rogers Park (South 75 Street and West Rogers Street). Rogers Playground (South 56 Street and West Rogers Street). Garfield School Park (South 84 Street and West National Avenue). Honey Creek Park and Settlement (South 84 Street and West National Avenue). Joyce Radtke Park (8320 West National Avenue). Klentz Park (2061 South 72 Street). Liberty Heights Park (1540 South 62 Street). North Greenfield Railroad Station Park (8139 West National Avenue). Reservoir Park (9621 West Lapham Street). McKinley Park Playground (South 72 Street and West Washington Avenue)

- Board of Public Works. The <u>B</u>board of Ppublic <u>₩w</u>orks shall govern, manage and control all parks, <u>boulevards</u>, <u>green spaces</u>, <u>terrace areas</u>, and parklands within the City in accordance with <u>SeeWis. Stat.</u> 27.08(3)of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- 3. Director of Public Works. Under the direction of the Board of Public Works, tThe Delirector of Ppublic Wworks shall have authority to:
 - a. <u>mManage</u>, change, improve and maintain parks and parklands as authorized by the board of public works.
 - <u>b.</u> subject to the approval of the Common Council, prepare and a<u>A</u>dminister the <u>City's</u> policies and procedures for the preservation and use of City parks and parklands, including, but not limited to, adopting rules of conduct and other regulations and instituting a permit system for use of park facilities
 - c. Issue park permits
 - i. Application. Any person who wishes to use an area of a park to the exclusion of the general public shall obtain a park permit. The person shall submit an application to the director of public works that includes all the following:
 - (1) Applicant's name, address, phone number, and email address
 - (2) The park rental area for which the applicant is seeking a permit and the date sought
 - (3) Whether alcohol will be consumed at the park
 - (4) Any other relevant information deemed necessary by the director of public works
 - <u>ii.</u> Issuance. The director shall issue a park permit to any applicant if all the following conditions are satisfied:
 - (1) The applicant is at least 18 years old
 - (2) No other park permit has been issued for an overlapping date and time, and no park permit application for an overlapping date and time was submitted prior and is still pending
 - (3) The applicant pays the proper permit fee listed in the Fee Schedule
 - (4) <u>The applicant agrees to be financially responsible for any</u> <u>damages incurred by the city at the park rental area during the</u> <u>permitted time.</u>
 - (5) The applicant agrees to any other conditions imposed by the director of public works.
 - iii. Terms of Use. Each applicant for a park permit shall be bound by the following conditions:
 - (1) A permittee shall ensure that the use of the park rental area does not significantly impair or detract from the use of the remaining area of the park by the public.
 - (2) A permittee shall ensure that all persons utilizing the permitted

rental area comply with all laws.

- (3) A permittee shall leave the permitted rental area and any city property or equipment in at least as good of condition as it was upon the permittee's arrival.
- (4) A permittee shall ensure no alcohol is consumed in the permitted rental area unless specifically authorized by the park permit.
- iv. Cancellation. A permittee may cancel the permit at any time. If a permit is canceled prior to the date of the permit, the director shall retain 20% of the fee amount for administrative expenses and refund the remaining balance. No refund will be issued for cancellations on the date of the permit.
- v. Revocation. The director of public works may revoke a permit if the permit holder violates any terms of use. No refund will be issued if a permit is revoked.
- 4. Trees and Plant Materials.
 - a. Planting Regulations.
 - i. The Forestry Division of the Department of Public Works is responsible for the planting of all trees and other plant material in City parks and parklands in accordance with the policies and procedures of the Department.
 - ii. The Forestry Division shall determine the location and species of all plant materials planted in City parks and parklands.
 - iii. The Forestry Division may, at its discretion, remove or cause the removal of any tree or plant material located in City parks or on City parklands deemed inappropriate or hazardous.
 - b. Maintenance.
 - i. The Forestry Division shall be responsible for the maintenance of trees and other plant material on City parks and parklands except as provided herein.
 - ii. The owner, occupant or person in charge of each lot or parcel of land shall maintain the terrace area between the walk and the curb or, in the absence of a sidewalk, the area between the pavement and the property line.
 - In lawn terrace areas, grass and weeds shall be maintained at a height not to exceed six (6) inches in length. Noxious weeds shall be destroyed as provided in see<u>Wis. Stat</u>.
 66.0407(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes. Such areas shall be kept in good condition and repair and free from debris.
 - (2) In paved terrace areas, the pavement shall be kept free and clear of weeds, vegetative materials and debris.
 - (3) If the owner, occupant or person in charge of any property fails to maintain the terrace area abutting their property as provided in Paragraphs "a" and "b", the Director of Public Works or his designated agent, after giving five (5) days

written notice to the owner, occupant or person in charge of the property, is authorized to perform the required maintenance. The cost of such maintenance shall be charged against the owner of the property as provided is <u>seeWis. Stat.</u> 66.0703-of the Wisconsin Statutes.

- (4) In any one (1) calendar year, where, on private property, the Director has authorized required maintenance, as described in Subsection 2c above, subsequent required maintenance shall not require a five (5) day written notice prior to the Director again authorizing the performance of maintenance on said property.
- iii. No person shall plant, cut, prune, or remove any tree or shrub in a City park or parkland or cut, disturb or interfere in any way with the roots of any tree or spray trees or shrubs with any chemical herbicide or insecticide in a City park or parkland, without first receiving permission from the Director of Public Works. Such permission is not required for the use of products associated with the maintenance of turf in the area between the pavement and adjacent property line.
- iv. No person shall break or injure any tree or shrub planted in any City park or parkland.
- 5. Public Use of Parks. All parks shall be open to use by the public except as limited by this subsection.
 - a. Hours of Operation. No person may enter or remain in a park in violation of the hours posted by the director of public works unless authorized by a park permit. If no hours are posted, no person may enter or remain in a park between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. unless authorized by a park permit.
 - b. Temporary Closure. No person may enter or remain in an area of a park closed by the director of public works for construction, maintenance, or other reasons.
 - c. No Trespass Order. No person may enter or remain in a park during the time that a no trespass order prohibits the person from entering or remaining in that park.
 - i. Issuance. A police officer may issue and serve a no trespass order to a person if that person has committed a law violation in a park. A no trespass order may be effective for up to 1 year after the date of issuance.
 - ii. Content. The order shall contain the following information:
 - (1) The name of the person against whom it is issued;
 - (2) The signature of the issuing police officer;
 - (3) The date of issuance;
 - (4) The date, time, location, and type of the law violation that justifies the no trespass order;
 - (5) The duration of the order;
 - (6) <u>A list of the prohibited park(s);</u>

- (7) Notice of the penalties for an act in violation of the order; and
- (8) Notice of the right to appeal the order's issuance.
- iii. Appeal. Any person who has been served a no trespass order may appeal the order by submitting an appeal form to the City Clerk within 10 calendar days of issuance of the no trespass order.
- iv. Scheduling. The City Clerk shall notify the appellant and the City Attorney of the hearing date, time, and location, and shall schedule the hearing no more than 30 days after the appeal is filed.
- v. <u>Hearing</u>. The administrative appeals review board shall hear the appeal. The administrative appeals review board shall uphold a reasonable order, modify the order to ensure the order is reasonable, or rescind the order if it is not reasonable.
- <u>d.</u> Park Permit. No person may enter or remain in a park rental area during the time in which a park permit is effective for that rental area, unless allowed by the permit holder.

- 1. Definitions. As used in this section.
 - a. "Parks" means any and all the following locations:.
 - i. Arnold Klentz Park (2601 South 72 Street)
 - ii. Burnham Pointe Park (6031 West Burnham Street)
 - iii. Honey Creek Park (1999 South 84 Street)
 - iv. Joyce Radtke Skate Park (8320 West National Avenue)
 - v. Kopperud Park (South 76 Street and West Pierce Street)
 - vi. Liberty Heights Park (1540 South 62 Street)
 - vii. Mini Park (South 58 Street and West Beloit Road)
 - viii. Mini Park (South 60 Street and West National Avenue)
 - ix. Railroad Park (West National Avenue and South 82 Street)
 - x. Reservoir Park (9621 West Lapham Street)
 - xi. Rogers Park '(2023 South 75 Street)
 - xii. Rogers Playground (2014 South 56 Street)
 - xiii. Roosevelt Park (938 South 58 Street)
 - xiv. Veterans Memorial Park (West National Avenue and South 70 Street)
 - xv. West Allis Dog Park (11200 West Hayes Avenue)
 - xvi. West Allis Farmer's Market (6501 West National Avenue)

"Assault" means any intentional act to harmfully or offensively contact another person, including attempts or threats.

- b. "Sexual act" means any act of masturbation, sexual gratification, sexual intercourse, physical contact with or exposure of a person's genital or pubic area, buttocks, or, if the person is a female, breast (excluding a mother breast-feeding a child).
- 2. Authority. The Police Department has the authority to issue and serve no trespass orders informing the recipient that he or she is prohibited from entering or remaining in or upon any or all City parks.
- 3. An officer may issue an order to a person if:
 - a. Said person has received a municipal citation for an incident that occurred in a park; or
 - b. A police officer has probable cause to believe said person has done one (1) or more of the following while in a park:
 - i. Committed an assault on another person;
 - ii. Sold or consumed alcohol;
 - iii. Sold, possessed, or used illegal drugs;
 - iv. Brandished or used any weapon, excluding bats or other devices used during a sporting event in the context of a game;
 - v. Caused damage, including graffiti, to any park property;
 - vi. Committed a sexual act;
 - vii. Acted in a violent, indecent, profane, abusive, unreasonably loud, or otherwise disorderly manner.
- 4. Order must be in writing. All orders shall be in writing and contain the following elements:
 - a. The name of the prohibited person;
 - b. The signature of the issuing police officer;
 - c. The date of issuance;
 - d. The reason for issuance;
 - e. The duration of the order, up to one (1) year;
 - f. A list of the prohibited park(s);
 - g. Notice of the penalties for an act in violation of the order; and
 - h. Notice of the right to appeal the order's issuance.
- 5. Appeal. A recipient of a no trespass order may appeal issuance or terms of the order by submitting a written appeal to the City Clerk.
 - a. Such appeal shall be in writing, and shall be filed with the City Clerk within ten (10) calendar days of issuance of the no trespass order.
 - b. Hearing. The Public Works Committee shall hold a hearing to make a final determination of the validity of the no trespass order.
 - i. The City Clerk shall notify the appellant and the City Attorney of the hearing date, time, and location, and shall schedule the hearing no more than thirty (30) days after the appeal is filed.
 - ii. Proof of a conviction in municipal or circuit court from the incident that led to the issuance of the no trespass order shall be sufficient cause to uphold the issuance of the no trespass order.

6. Penalty. Any person who violates any provision in this section shall, upon conviction, pay a forfeiture not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.), together with the costs of prosecution, and upon default of payment thereof, shall be imprisoned in the House of Correction until such forfeiture and costs are paid, but not more than the number of days set forth in Wis. Stats. § 800.095(4). Each and every day of violation constitutes a separate offense.

RESOLUTION AMENDING POLICIES RELATED TO CITY PARKS

REPEALING POLICY # 2107 AND CREATING POLICY # 2108

WHEREAS, Policy # 2107 was in need of a substantial update to reflect changes in the municipal code and city's practices;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City Of West Allis, in the State of Wisconsin, as follows:

SECTION 1: <u>**REPEAL**</u> "2107 Park Regulations And Permits" of the City Of West Allis Policies & Procedures is hereby *repealed* as follows:

R E P E A L

2107 Park Regulations And Permits (Repealed)

- 1. PURPOSE To describe the policies of the City of West Allis regarding the use of Parks, providing a permit system for certain activities, and prescribing rules of conduct in City Parks.
- 2. ORGANIZATIONS AND PERSONS AFFECTED This policy applies to all City of West Allis departments, boards, commissions, and to the general public.
- 3. POLICY It is the policy of the Department of Public Works to follow a uniform procedure for use of City Parks by the general public.
- 4. REFERENCE City of West Allis Revised Municipal Code Section 11.13.
- 5. PROCEDURES
 - a. **RESPONSIBILITY**

The Director of Public Works shall be responsible for administering this policy and, where applicable, establishing fees associated with this policy. All fees shall be approved by the Board of Public Works.

- **b. GENERAL POLICIES**
 - i. Definitions. For the purposes of this policy, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings given herein. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory. The pronouns "he" and "his" include the pronouns "she" and "her".
 - (1) Alcohol beverage means distilled spirits and all beverages containing one-half of one (0.5) per cent or more alcohol by

volume, including beer and wine. Medicines or drugs dispensed pursuant to a physician's prescription are excluded.

- (2) Amplified sound and/or sound-emanating equipment means music, sound wave, vibration or speech projected or transmitted by electronic equipment, including, but not limited to, public address systems, amplifiers, horns and megaphones.
- (3) Animal means any cat, dog, horse, fowl and living creature other than a human.
- (4) Applicant means any person seeking a permit to use or conduct an activity in a Park or facility.
- (5) At large. Any animal not under restraint while off the premises of the owner.
- (6) City means the City of West Allis.
- (7) Civic, educational or community service group means any not-for-profit group primarily devoted to the advancement of civic, educational or community service purposes.
- (8) Domestic animal. Any animal not deemed to be a wild or exotic animal pursuant to Section 7.12 of the Revised Municipal Code.
- (9) Facility means any building or area owned, equipped and maintained by the City for public use.
- (10) Limited membership group means denominational groups, partisan political groups, labor organizations and other such groups where membership is limited or not open to the general public.
- (11) Nonrecurring use means infrequent use of a specific facility or the use of a facility on a special event basis (i.e., annual picnics, private parties or company-sponsored events).
- (12) Organized play means six persons or more engaging in a team sport athletic contest, such as, but not limited to, soccer, baseball, softball, football, basketball, or volleyball; this shall not apply for infrequent use.
- (13) Park means all real properties owned or controlled by the City and designated on a map maintained in the office of the City Clerk, regardless of the extent of development or official designation, which serve as picnic grounds, recreation areas, and nature areas. Park facilities include, but are not limited to, open space play areas, picnic shelters or pavilions, park benches, bike trails, restrooms, etc.
- (14) Permit means any written license issued by or under the authority of the Director of Public Works or his designee permitting a use, event or activity in a park or recreation area or facility.
- (15) Person means any individual, child, firm, association,

partnership, estate, trust, business trust, syndicate, fiduciary, corporation, and all other groups or combinations.

- (16) Political activities mean activities engaged in by candidates for public office, political groups, political parties or political committees.
- (17) Professional association means a group formed by practitioners of a specific profession or occupation.
- (18) Recreation facility means a building, structure, field, court, or park which has organized recreational activities for teams and individuals or which provides active facility sites for nonorganized leisure play.
- (19) Recurring use means repeated use of a specific facility on a regularly scheduled basis (i.e., leagues, organized play, monthly meetings, etc.).
- (20) Reserved use means exclusive, permitted use for one or more occasions.
- (21) Resident means a person or the minor children of the person who owns or leases real property within the city limits or who maintains either a voting residence or bona fide occupancy within the city limits.
- (22) Service animal means any animal meeting the definition in Section 106.52(1)(fm) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
- (23) Special event means an event that takes place on public property which, because of its scope and impact on surrounding areas and the potential need for provision of extra services by the city, requires a permit issued by the Director of Public Works or his designee. Special events include, but are not limited to, circuses, carnivals, festivals, parades and filming for commercial purposes. The location of a circus, carnival or other similar special event shall require the approval of the Director of Public Works or his designee.
- (24) Vehicle means every device in, upon or by which any person or property may be transported or drawn upon a highway, excepting devices used exclusively upon station rails or tracks.
- ii. Rules for Use of Parks. Hours of use parks and outdoor recreation facilities.
 - (1) 1.) It shall be unlawful to congregate in or use any Park after 10:00 p.m. and before 6:00 a.m., except for the following:
 - (A) Those organized recreational or cultural activities where the organizer has obtained a permit for use of the Park beyond 10:00 p.m. A permit for the use of a Park beyond 10:00 p.m. may be issued to the organizer of a cultural or recreational activity by the Director of Public Works or his designee.

- (B) Any Park where a sign is posted that specifies closing hours other than those specified in paragraph (1).
- (2) The Director of Public Works or his designee may post a sign that specifies closing hours other than those specified in paragraph (a) or (b) for any Park subject to the following guidelines:
 - (A) The amount of daylight at the time of year during which the closing hours will be in effect;
 - (B) Available artificial lighting in the Park;
 - (C) The City's ability to provide and the cost of providing adequate police protection in the Park during the hours in which it is open;
 - (D) The occurrence of acts of vandalism and other crimes in the Park;
 - (E) The need to prevent deterioration of existing shrubbery and grass in the Park or the need to protect new plantings of grass and shrubbery.
- (3) Except for unusual and unforeseen emergencies, Parks shall be open to the public every day of the year during designated hours.
- (4) The Director of Public Works or his designee may close any Park or any section thereof, or prohibit certain uses in any Park for the time necessary to remedy any unforeseen circumstances, effect repairs, or provide maintenance. No person in a Park shall enter an area posted as being closed to the public without the permission of the Director of Public Works or his designee.
- iii. Prohibited Acts. Prohibited acts in Parks.
 - It shall be unlawful for any person in or using a Park to either perform or allow the performance of any of the following acts, unless such activity is authorized, permitted or supervised by the City:
 - (A) Damaging property. No person shall willfully mark, deface, damage, displace, remove or tamper with any Park or facility buildings, tables, benches, railing, paving or paving materials, water lines or other utilities, permanent or temporary signs, placards or notices, monuments, stakes, posts, boundary markers or other structures, equipment or Parks or recreation property.
 - (B) Improperly using Park structures, equipment and furniture.
 - (a) No person shall climb on or over any building, facility, structure, or natural feature

in a Park unless the same is intentionally designed for climbing purposes.

- (b) No person over the age of fourteen (14) years shall trespass upon or play upon or use the playground equipment at any Park other than those swings designated for adult use.
- (c) No person shall recline upon any seat, table, bench, or in any location not intended for such occupancy.
- (d) No person over the age of six (6) years, unless accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult, shall enter into or loiter near any Park structure or section thereof reserved and designated by the city for exclusive use by the opposite sex.
- (e) The Director of Public Works or his designee may post specific rules for each facility.
- (C) Polluting waters. No person shall throw, discharge or otherwise place or cause to be placed in the waters of any fountain, pond or lake or any storm sewer or drain flowing into such waters any substance, matter or things, liquid or solid, which will or may result in the pollution of such waters.
- (D) Removing soil or plants. No person shall dig or remove any soil, rock, stones, trees, shrubs or plants, down-timber or other wood or materials, or make any excavation by tool, equipment, blasting or other means, except that digging shall be permitted in areas designated for such purpose. Collection of natural objects, including plant and animal life and minerals, for scientific and educational purposes may be conducted in compliance with terms of written permits granted by Director of Public Works or his designee.
- (E) Damaging plants. No person shall damage, cut, carve, transplant or remove any tree or plant, or injure the bark or pick the flowers or seeds of any tree or plant, nor shall any person attach any rope, wire or other contrivance to any tree or plant. No person shall dig in or otherwise disturb grass areas, or in any other way injure or impair the natural beauty or usefulness of any area.
- (F) Harming or molesting animal life. No person shall molest, harm, frighten, kill, trap, hunt, chase, capture, shoot or throw missiles at any mammal, bird, reptile

or amphibian; nor shall any person remove or in any way harm the eggs, nest or young of any mammal, bird, reptile or amphibian. This paragraph does not apply to persons fishing in accordance with State Law.

- (G) Littering. No person shall bring in or dump, deposit or leave any bottles, broken glass, ashes, paper, boxes, cans, dirt, rubbish, waste, garbage, refuse or other litter, or place refuse or litter in any waters in or contiguous to any Park or facility, or anywhere on the grounds thereof, other than in the proper receptacles, where provided.
- (H) Igniting fires. No person shall ignite or attempt to ignite any fire against or on any vegetation or Park or facility structure, except in designated fireplaces or grills when used for cooking. Persons may use a personal grill in a designated picnic area; however, they will be responsible for the proper off-site disposal of all charcoal, wood chips or other cooking materials after such use if City designated receptacles are not available. No person shall dispose of burning matches, smoking materials or other inflammable items within any Park or recreation area except in designated receptacles.
- (I) Unauthorized operation of vehicles. No person shall drive or otherwise operate a vehicle in a Park or recreation area upon surfaces other than those maintained and open to the public for purposes of vehicular travel, except upon temporary parking areas as may be designated from time to time by the Director of Public Works or his designee, and further excepting vehicles in the service of the city, animal control vehicles, law enforcement vehicles, and motorized wheelchairs.
- (J) Unauthorized parking. No person shall park a vehicle in an area other than an established or designated parking area. No person shall park a vehicle overnight or park a vehicle having a gross weight exceeding three (3) tones without written approval of the Director of Public Works or his designee. Vehicles in violation of this paragraph may be towed and stored at the owner's expense.
- (K) Possessing or consuming alcoholic beverages. No person shall possess and/or consume alcohol beverages provided, however, that alcohol beverages

may be permitted by the Director of Public Works or his designee for special events or in specified facilities and where a permit pursuant to Section 9.02(2) of the Revised Municipal Code and Sections 125.26(6) and 125.51(10) Wis. Stat.

- (L) Possessing or discharging weapons, explosives, etc.
 - (a) No person shall carry or discharge firearms, firecrackers, rockets, or other types of explosives, nor shall any person carry or use any object calculated to make a noise sufficient to disturb the peace or quiet of the Park. No person shall carry or discharge any gun, pistol, slingshot or similar device, or any bows and arrows, or carry or use any other object capable of propelling a projectile in any Park or facility, nor shall any person carry on his person, any knife, dagger or similar weapon.
 - (b) The provisions of paragraph (1) shall not be deemed to prohibit the carrying of ordinary tools or equipment for use in a lawful occupation or a fireworks exhibition sponsored or approved by the City.
- (M) Vending, soliciting, advertising, etc. No person shall practice, carry on, conduct or solicit for any occupation, business, or profession in any Park or sell or offer for sale any food, beverage, merchandise, article, or anything whatsoever in any Park. This paragraph shall not apply to any person acting pursuant to a contract with the City or under a special event permit granted by the city. No person shall distribute, post, place or erect any advertising, handbill, circular, bill, notice, placard, paper or other advertisement device in any Park. No person shall beg or solicit contributions.
- (N) Operating sound amplification equipment. No person shall install, use, and operate within a Park a loudspeaker, horn, megaphone device, or other sound amplifying equipment for the purposes of giving instructions, directions, talks, addresses, or lectures, or of transmitting music to any persons or groups of persons in any Park, or in the vicinity thereof, except when installed, used, or operated in compliance with a special event permit issued by the City and when operated in accordance with the terms of the permit.

Amplifiers permitted in Parks shall be operated only through a power source provided or approved by the City or with a battery. This paragraph shall not apply to the use of a loudspeaker or other sound amplifying device that might be used on an athletic field during an athletic game or other competition sponsored by a school or community organization.

- (O) Launching or operating aircraft, radio-controlled model airplanes, etc. No person shall launch or operate any aircraft, including but not limited to, hot air balloons, airplanes, ultralights, helicopters and gliders except in areas or at times specifically designated for this purpose by special permit issued by the Director of Public Works or his designee. No person shall launch or operate any radio-controlled model rockets, airplanes, gliders, boats or vehicles except in areas or at times specifically designated for this purpose by special permit issued by the City.
- (P) Camping. No person shall camp in a Park or recreation area except at such times and places as may be designated by the Director of Public Works or his designee and except pursuant to a special permit issued by the City.
- (Q) Erecting structures. No person shall construct or erect any building or structure of whatever kind, whatever permanent or temporary in character, or run or string any public service utility into, upon, or across a Park except as authorized by special permit issued by the City and in an area and manner approved by the Director of Public Works of his designee.
- (R) Endangering the public. No person shall endanger the safety of any person or group by any conduct or act or by any failure to observe the rules established by this policy.
- (S) Interfering with use of a Park by others. No person or group shall prevent any other person or group from using any Park or any of its facilities, or interfere with such use in compliance with this policy and with the rules applicable to such use. Conducting activities authorized by a reserved use permit issued pursuant to this policy shall not constitute a violation of this section. No persons shall interfere with the right of a person or group occupying or using a Park or facility under a permit allowing for such use.

iv. Use Permits: Application. Permits to be issued as follows:

- (1) Any Park use permits required by this policy shall be issued in accordance with the procedures, standards and conditions provided in this policy. A permit issued by the Director of Public Works or his designee and accepted by signature of the permittee shall constitute a contract for use of the Park or portion thereof.
- (2) All requests for permits required under this policy shall be made in writing, upon an application form to be furnished by the City, which shall require the following information:
 - (A) The name and address of the applicant proposing or sponsoring the activity involved. Photo identification may be required.
 - (B) The type of permit requested and the purposes or activity proposed thereunder.
 - (C) The date and hours for which the permit is desired.
 - (D) The specific Park area for which the permit is requested.
 - (E) The proposed number of persons who will attend or participate in the activity involved.
 - (F) The number of youths who will attend or participate in the activity involved and the name of adults who will be present to chaperone.
 - (G) Whether or not alcohol will be served.
 - (H) A statement of any special circumstances which are material to the permit requested.
 - (I) Such other relevant information as the Director of Public Works or his designee may reasonably require in regard to the application.
- (3) Applicants may be required to provide liability insurance if, in the discretion of the Director of Public Works, City Administrator and City Attorney, the requested use of the facility represents a significant risk of loss to the City.
- (4) Parks use permits will be issued to adults and adult sponsors of youth groups only.
- (5) The permittee listed on the Park use permit as "person in charge" shall be responsible for the condition of the Park or facility after its use. All other conditions listed on the Park use permit shall apply.
- v. Permit Fees. Permit fees for reserved use.
 - (1) The Director of Public Works or his designee, upon approval by the Board of Public Works, is authorized to establish fees for reserved use of a Park, or a specified facility therein and to offset the cost to the public for additional services provided by the City in connection with such use. Such fees are

established in Section 8 of this policy and may be amended from time to time.

- (2) A fee will not be charged for use of a Park for City sponsored or co-sponsored program or event.
- (3) A reservation fee shall be charged at the time the Park is reserved that will roll over into a damage deposit at the time of the event and be refunded if there is no damage and the Park has been satisfactorily cleaned up after its use. The balance of the fee must be paid prior to use of the Park in accordance with requirements of the applicable section of the ordinance.
- (4) If cancellation of an approved reservation is necessary, it is the permittee's responsibility to provide immediate written notification of such intent to cancel use.
- (5) Cancellations will only be accepted from the permittee (the person who signed the reservation application) and not from anyone else acting on behalf of the permittee.
- (6) In the event of a cancellation, refund of the reservation fee will be handled as follows:
 - (A) If 30 days or more remain before the date for which the facility is reserved, 100% of the reservation will be refunded less a \$10.00 administrative fee.
 - (B) If fewer than 30 days but more than 14 days remain before the date for which the facility is reserved, 50% of the reservation fee will be refunded except where the amount to be refunded is less than the \$10.00 administrative fee.
 - (C) If less than 14 days cancellation notice is provided, the city will retain the entire reservation fee.
- vi. Deadline for Application. Deadlines for submittal of permit applications prior to the date of a particular use shall be established for each type of facility; however, any use requiring approval as a special event or which requires a temporary street closing shall require that the application be submitted at least forty-five (45) days prior to the event. The Director of Public Works or his designee may waive this deadline for extenuating circumstances, but sufficient time must remain before the event for staff review of the application.
- vii. Standards for Permit Issuance.
 - (1) If the Park or facility will be available for use on the date and time requested, and is not subject to a prior reservation, the Director of Public Works or his designee shall issue a permit under this policy when he finds the use applied for to be in accordance with the purpose for which such Park or facility property is designed or intended, and further that the proposed activity will not unreasonably interfere with or

detract from the general public enjoyment of the remaining Park, or interfere with or endanger public health, welfare or safety, or be reasonably calculated to incite violence, crime or disorderly conduct on the part of the participants or entail unusual, extraordinary or burdensome expense for supervision, maintenance, cleanup or police protection by the City. In the event of scheduling conflicts, i.e., when an application is submitted by two or more persons at the same time for the same facility, priority shall be given to City residents. Thereafter, permits shall be issued to qualifying applicants on a first-come, first-served basis.

- (2) Eligibility for permitted use of Parks is limited to activities which are free and open to residents of the City without regard for sex, age, race, religion or national origin except that an event sponsored or co-sponsored by the City may charge a fee.
- viii. Conditions of Permits.
 - Permits will be issued under this Policy subject to such special regulations and instructions as may be prescribed by the Director of Public Works or his designee including, but not limited to:
 - (A) Restrictions on the number of persons who may participate in such permitted activities.
 - (B) Restrictions on the days of the week and the time of day that the particular facility may be used by the permittee.
 - (C) Provisions for maintenance by the permittee of the sanitation, cleanliness, and appearance of the facility. At times, portable restrooms may be required for special events.
 - (D) Provisions for security and the maintenance of law and order, including compliance with noise, parking, safety and other appropriate regulations. It is at the City's discretion to require security on the premises. If security is deemed necessary, it is the responsibility of the permittee to reimburse the City for costs incurred in providing such security.
 - (E) Restrictions on the installation of apparatus or modification in any manner, either temporary or permanent, by the permittee to a sports field or adjacent structures.
 - (F) Requirements that all applicable fees shall be paid prior to use, unless other payment arrangements have been authorized.

- (G) Requirements that a certificate of insurance, naming the City as the additional insured, must be on file at the City prior to any permit being approved.
- (2) Permitees shall be bound by all Park rules and regulations and all applicable ordinances as fully as though such rules, regulations and ordinances were inserted in the permit.
- (3) Each permittee agrees to hold the City harmless from any claims for loss, injury or damage to any persons whatsoever caused by the negligence of the permittee in the exercise of such permit.
- ix. Approval/Denial of Permit. A permit shall only be approved by the Director of Public Works or his designee in accordance with this policy and any written rules and regulations specific to the facility. All such permits must be granted contingent upon the condition that rules, regulations and ordinances established by the City, or any other public entity having jurisdiction, will be observed. A decision by the Director of Public Works to deny a permit may be appealed to the Board of Public Works within 30 days of the decision. Appeals shall be filed with the City Clerk and shall be governed by Section 2.48(5) except that the decision of the Board of Public Works shall be the final determination.
- x. Revocation of Permit. The Director of Public Works or the Chief of Police or their designees shall have the authority to revoke a permit upon finding a violation of any rule or ordinance, or upon good cause shown. Revocation of a permit shall result in the forfeiture of the damage deposit. The permittee may appeal the revocation within 30 days to the Board of Public Works.
- xi. Term of Permit. All permits issued under this policy shall expire on the date specified therein.
- xii. Transfer of Permit. No permit issued under this policy shall be transferable.
- xiii. Liability Insurance for Certain Permits.
 - (1) The Director of Public Works or his designee, in consultation with and upon the approval of the City Administrator & City Attorney, may require an organized activity taking place at any City Park or facility to have insurance for said activity if, in their opinion, the activity represents a significant risk to the City. When required, permittee shall procure and maintain for the term of the permit insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the activities described hereunder performed by the permittee, his agents, representatives, or employees. Except where otherwise specified in this policy, insurance shall be provided in an amount to be determined by the Director of Public Works or his designee. Insurance is to be

placed with insurers authorized to do business in the state and acceptable to the City.

- (2) In all cases, for moon walks, bounce houses or other inflatable structures, a Certificate of Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 dollars in general liability insurance shall be provided naming the City of West Allis as an additional insured party.
- (3) The certificate of insurance and endorsements, naming the City as the additional insured waiving subrogation and providing a 10 day Notice of Cancellation are to be submitted prior to permit authorization or execution of a negotiated use agreement. The certificate and endorsements shall be in as form approved by the City Attorney.
- (4) Where insurance is determined to be required for a particular use of a Park or a one-time special event, the City is authorized to provide insurance for that use or event through the City's insurance provider as an alternative to the private purchase of such insurance. The person or organization requesting the permit will be required to reimburse the City for the cost of such insurance prior to issuance of the permit.

xiv. General Rules for Permitted Activities.

- (1) Reservations/Application.
 - (A) Parks, that portion of the Park applicable or a facility therein may be reserved for use between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. except that upon approval by the Board of Public Works, the times may be extended.
 - (B) All fees must be paid prior to use of the Park or facility. If paid by check, all fees are payable in full no later than fourteen days prior to the event. Cash payment will be required if fees are paid less than fourteen days prior to the event.
 - (C) A reservation fee shall be charged at the time the Park is reserved that will roll over into a damage deposit at the time of the event and be refunded if there is no damage and the facility has been satisfactorily cleaned up after its use. The balance of the fee must be paid no later than fourteen days prior to use of the facility. A use permit shall not be issued if all required fees have not been paid.
 - (D) Reservations shall be made no less than two weeks in advance and no more than six (6) months in advance.
 - (E) All applicants must be 21 years of age or older and must be present throughout the entire use of the Park

or facility.

- (F) Reservation of a Park or facility is normally limited to one reservation per month by any one group. Exceptions may be approved by the Director of Public Works or his designee based on a space available basis.
- (G) Rental hours must include time needed for delivery of supplies, set-up of tables and chairs and cleanup.
- (H) The City reserves the right to deny any facility use request in accordance with standards for issuance of permits as provided in this policy.
- (2) Alcohol beverages. Alcohol beverages are allowed by permit. An applicant wishing to obtain a permit shall apply to the City Clerk for such permit as well as a temporary alcohol permit under Section 9.02(2) and 125.26(6) and 125.51(10).
 - (A) If a permit is issued for a non-alcoholic event and alcohol is found on the premises, the police will shut down the event and no deposit will be refunded. The term on the premises shall include parking lots and all surrounding exterior public property.
 - (B) If an event is shut down by the police for any reason, the clean-up/damage deposit will be forfeited.
- (3) Use of facility equipment.
 - (A) The City may charge a fee for the rental of equipment including tables and chairs.
 - (B) The permittee is responsible for arranging tables and chairs for their specific purpose and returning the tables and chairs to their stored or original location/configuration. At no time should anyone stand on tables or chairs or sit on tables. Any need for tables and chairs in excess of what is available at a particular facility shall be provided by the permittee.
 - (C) Use of equipment that is available for reservation in a specific facility shall be reserved when the application if filed. A list of equipment available for reservation will be provided with written procedures for the reservation of that facility. The City may charge a fee for the rental of equipment.
 - (D) All equipment and materials not belonging to the City must be removed at the end of each scheduled use. There are no facilities available for storage of equipment or materials used for meetings.
 - (E) Use of decorations.
 - (a) Any decorating, or covering of, or changes to the facilities shall be discussed at the time

of application. The permittee shall be responsible for putting up any decorations and all other special preparations necessary for the function. All decorations shall be removed at the conclusion of the function. Permittee shall be responsible for the removal of all decorations, special preparations, and permittee's personal property, owned or rented.

- (b) All decorations must be applied with duct or masking tape. The use of cellophane adhesive tape, nails, staples, screws, etc. is not allowed on walls or ceilings. Staples and pushpins are allowed only on tackstrips and bulletin boards. All tape and string must be removed from all surfaces and equipment at the conclusion of the event.
- (c) Decorations may not be hung from light fixtures, ceilings, heat detectors, emergency lights, or acoustical wall/ceiling tiles. Decorations may not be applied to wood floors.
- (d) All plants, trees and shrubs must be in waterproof containers and must be carefully placed so as not to damage floors or tables or block exits.
- (e) No open flames, such as lighted candles, are allowed.
- (f) No foreign substance may be applied to the floor.
- (g) No rice, birdseed, confetti, etc. is permitted in the facilities or on surrounding sidewalks and parking lots.
- (4) Liability for damage to facility/Requirement for insurance.
 - (A) The permittee shall be responsible for any and all damage to the facility premises and property therein and shall be responsible for all actions, behavior and damages caused by their guests or attendees.
 - (B) The City is not responsible for accidents, injury, illness or loss of group or individual property.
 - (C) Prior to issuance of the permit, all approved applicants shall execute a Hold Harmless/Indemnification Agreement releasing the City of all liability from activities conducted in

community facilities.

- xv. Additional Rule-Making Authority. In addition to enforcement of general rules provided by this policy, the Director of Public Works or his designee may prescribe reasonable rules for enforcement in specific Parks or facilities. All such rules shall supplement and be consistent with rules provided by this policy. All specific rules shall be posted in a conspicuous place at the facility where the rules apply.
- xvi. Endorsement not implied. The fact that a group is permitted to meet in a Park or facility does not constitute an endorsement of the group's policies or beliefs by the City.
- xvii. Sales in Parks. No person, firm or corporation shall sell any commodity upon the grounds of any Park without first obtaining a permit as provided in section 9.18 of the Revised Municipal Code.
- xviii. Effect of Permit. Any person holding a permit for use of a Park or portion thereof only entitle the permit holder to use the facility or that portion of the Park to the exclusion of others.
- xix. Domestic Animals.
 - Pets are permitted, except where posted, in Parks if adequately restrained except for designated dog Parks. Dogs must be kept at all times on leashes no longer than eight (8) feet. All animal excrement must be properly cleaned up and properly disposed of by the owner or keeper of the animal.
 - (2) No person shall bring into any Park any animal that constitutes a safety hazard or detriment to the enjoyment of the area by the public.
 - (3) No person in charge of any dog shall permit, allow or suffer such dog to enter upon or remain within any playground or Park area reserved for children or to enter any sandbox or play apparatus area.
 - (4) Horseback riding is not permitted in Parks.
 - (5) Domestic animals, except for service animals, are not permitted inside city facilities.
- xx. Alcohol beverages. No person shall sell, offer for consumption, or consume any alcoholic beverage, including beer and wine, within any Park except that the Common Council may approve the sale or consumption of beer and/or wine coolers in a Park in conjunction with the issuance of a special event permit when possession and consumption is specifically authorized under state law.
- 6. APPEAL The granting or denial of an application for use of a Park may be appealed, in writing, to the City of West Allis Board of Public Works. The appeal shall be filed within 30 days of the grant or denial and shall be filed with the City Clerk. The Board of Public Works shall conduct a hearing on the appeal within 20 business days of the filing of the appeal unless such time is extended by mutual consent. The decision of the Board of Public Works shall constitute a final decision of the Common Council under section 2.48(5) and any person aggrieved by the decision of the Board of Public

Works may appeal to circuit court as provided by Wisconsin Statutes.

- 7. ENFORCEMENT/PENALTIES
 - a. It shall be unlawful for any person to do any act prohibited or fail to perform any act required by this policy. Any person who fails to comply with any lawful and reasonable order given by law enforcement officers or authorized city official shall be in violation of Section 11.17 of the Revised Municipal Code.

The Department of Public Works, city law enforcement officers, or any employee so designated by the Department of Public Works shall have the authority to eject from a Park any person in violation of the policy, the Revised Municipal Code, or Wisconsin Statutes.

- 8. FEES
 - a. Applicable fees and deposits, as approved by the Board of Public Works, shall be listed on the permit application.

SECTION 2: <u>ADOPTION</u> "2108 Park Policies" of the City Of West Allis Policies & Procedures is hereby *added* as follows:

ADOPTION

2108 Park Policies(Added)

- 1. <u>PURPOSE To describe the policies of the City of West Allis regarding the use of Parks.</u>
- 2. ORGANIZATIONS AND PERSONS AFFECTED This policy applies to all City of West Allis departments, boards, and commissions.
- 3. POLICY It is the policy of the Department of Public Works to follow a uniform procedure for use of City Parks by the general public.
- 4. <u>REFERENCE City of West Allis Revised Municipal Code Section 11.13.</u>
- 5. PROCEDURES
 - a. Alternative Closing Hours. The director of public works may establish closing hours other than those specified in WAMC 11.13 for any park and post signage displaying those closing hours, subject to the following guidelines:
 - i. The amount of daylight at the time of year during which the closing hours will be in effect;
 - ii. Available artificial lighting in the Park;
 - iii. The City's ability to provide and the cost of providing adequate police protection in the Park during the hours in which it is open;
 - iv. The occurrence of acts of vandalism and other crimes in the Park;
 - v. The need to prevent deterioration of existing shrubbery and grass in

the Park or the need to protect new plantings of grass and shrubbery.

- <u>b.</u> Park Closure. The director of public works may close any park or any section thereof, or prohibit certain uses in any Park for the time necessary to remedy any unforeseen circumstances, effect repairs, or provide maintenance.
- c. <u>Conditions of Park Permits</u>. The director of public works may do any of the following regarding the issuance of park permits:
 - i. Limit the number of persons who may remain in the park rental area.
 - ii. Limit the days of the week and the time of day that the particular facility may be used by a permittee.
 - iii. Create rules for maintenance by the permittee of the sanitation, cleanliness, and appearance of a rental area or facility and whether a portable restroom is required.
 - iv. Issue a permit for hours outside the normal operating hours only upon approval by the public works committee.
- d. Additional Rule-Making Authority. In addition to enforcement of general rules provided by this policy, the director of public works may prescribe reasonable rules in specific parks or facilities. All such rules shall supplement and be consistent with rules provided by this policy. All specific rules shall be posted in a conspicuous place at the facility where the rules apply.

Dear Councilmen and Councilwomen,

Thank you for your time and consideration regarding my application for a liquor license in order to operate a tavern in the great city of West Allis!

I'm writing to introduce myself because although I know you will receive my background check, those documents will not be able to tell you my story, or why I am pursuing this dream.

I moved to the beautiful and bountiful state of Wisconsin when I was 15 years old with my family after spending 7 years in foster care and then being adopted by the most amazing people on Earth. I got my 1st job, as a bus girl, at 16 at Stoneridge Inn Supper Club in Muskego with my work permit. I went on to waitress at Aud-Mar on Muskego Lake, both still well-established restaurants today. 15 or 20 years ago I may have served you and your family at Genesis on Hwy 100 and Beloit, or at the Forum II on Layton Avenue. By that time I became a single mom and took up a career in office administration. When I turned 21, I became a bartender in order to help a friend at Shepherds Sports Lounge, where you can still come get a cocktail from me every Friday night – almost 20 years later. Over the last 20 years I have bartended for some of the most established and still running bars in West Allis including Spitfire's on State and Boz's. And although I no-longer partake in alcohol myself, I have close bonds and relationships with my old bosses and mentors and several of the tavern owners in West Allis currently. I have been in the service industry my entire life and operating a tavern has been a dream of mine for as long as I can remember.

Unfortunately my perfect streak came to an abrupt end in October 2022. I sold alcohol to a minor at my current job, Crawdaddy's on Greenfield during a West Allis Police Department sting operation. I asked the citing officer how this would affect my getting a license and he said he couldn't say, but that it would definitely be discussed. First, I want to say that I am not arguing the infraction. I did not ask for the customers' I.D., against my better judgement, and I paid the fine without argument or contest. I have to say, I'm glad I sold it to a police officer that did not drink the beverage and therefore **did not** go out and become a danger to themselves or others. My daughter's father was killed by a drunk driver when I was one month pregnant with our child. The person that killed him had been drinking at a bar underage. So I know all too well the consequences of irresponsible and underage drinking.

That being said, in my years behind the pine, I have participated in countless tavern checks where my license was verified to be valid. I have also been on the other side of several calls where my superior was notified that I DID NOT sell to any minors during their stings. So I consider it an **invaluable lesson learned** and that the one time in my 20 years that I sold alcohol to a minor, I can guarantee, was my last. I have had no other police contact since before the last time I sat in front of this council and you awarded me my bartending license, for which I am eternally grateful as it has been my livelihood ever since. Thank you.

Moving forward I would like the opportunity to bring the neighborhood together and create a strong sense of community. My goal is to bring a vibrant attitude and closeness to the people of that community. I fell in love with the space years ago and was sad to watch it decline over the years due to misuse and neglect. I have spent countless hours and resources of my own to revive and renew the space. Everything I have done has been to ensure that the building is in tip top shape and ready for inspection and to be operated to the fullest expectations of the board and the city.

If you grant me this license, I will create a safe environment that the girls would feel comfortable coming for drinks after work. Or that a gentleman could bring a lady on a first date. Or an established couple can come in for a nightcap after supper. I have specifically chosen my hours of operation to keep up with the way the bar scene is changing. I will also feature a whole line of non-alcoholic crafted beverages to appeal to designated drivers and patrons, like myself, that choose to not partake in alcohol consumption.

Finally I would like to thank you again for your time and consideration. I look forward to discussing all these details further and anything else you'd like to talk about when we meet face to face at the city council meeting. Thank you again.
