RESIDENTS**

WHEREAS, the City of West Allis' 2022 Adopted Budget included funding for a 1% pay increase for all non-represented employees, and an additional 1% increase for non-represented employees who are West Allis residents; and

WHEREAS, the salary schedule amendment shall apply to all non-represented city employees except those employees who are currently on a performance improvement plan or those who have not made satisfactory progress and/or completed their 2022-2023 goals as determined by the Department Head/Manager;

NOW THEREFORE, the common council of the City of West Allis do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1: **AMENDMENT** "Salary Schedule" of the City Of West Allis Municipal Code is hereby *amended* as follows:

A M E N D M E N T

Salary Schedule

1. Establishment. City employees and officers shall receive compensation based on the salary schedule in this ordinance, the terms of an employment contract, or the terms of a collective bargaining agreement.
2. Automatic Cost of Living Adjustments. This salary schedule does not include an automatic adjustment for personnel in conformity with fluctuations upwards and downwards in the cost of living.
3. Employee and Appointed Officer Salaries. Each City employee and officer who holds a position recognized within the salary schedule below shall receive compensation within the range assigned to the salary grade for that employee's or officer's position.

- The Plan Sponsor can subsidize different premium amounts for different classes of enrollees in a plan provided: 1) such classes are reasonable and based on objective business criteria, such as years of service, date of retirement, business location, job category, and nature of compensation (e.g., salaried vs. hourly), 2) the premium cannot vary for individuals within a given class of enrollees, and 3) the Plan Sponsor must pass through any direct subsidy payments received from CMS to reduce the amount that the beneficiary pays (or in those instances where the subscriber to or participant in the plan pays premiums on behalf of a Medicare eligible spouse or dependent, the amount the subscriber or participant pays). With regard to the Part D premium, different classes of enrollees cannot be based on eligibility for the Part D Low-Income Subsidy (LIS).
- If plan enrollees are entitled to a reduction of their premium as Part D LIS enrollees and Humana receives a Low-Income Premium Subsidy for such enrollees, Humana will pass the Low-Income Premium Subsidy amount through to the LIS enrollees to reduce their premiums.
- With regard to the Part D premium, the Plan Sponsor cannot charge an enrollee for prescription drug coverage provided under the PDP/MAPD plan more than the sum of his or her monthly beneficiary premium attributable to basic prescription drug coverage and 100% of the monthly beneficiary premium attributable to his or her non-Medicare Part D benefits (if any).

WHEREAS, the United States Department of the Treasury (“Treasury Department”) has distributed to DOA funds (“ARPA Funds”) from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 802, as added by section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (“ARPA”); and

WHEREAS, DOA is administering such funds through a variety of programs and initiatives; and

WHEREAS, a rule issued by the U.S. Treasury Department, which took effect on April 1, 2022 (the “Final Rule”), outlines the eligible uses of ARPA funds to include the provision of government services; and

WHEREAS, the program outlined by this MOU constitutes the provision of government services within the meaning of the Final Rule;

NOW, THEREFORE, DOA and Grantee agree that DOA shall grant, and Grantee may utilize, certain ARPA Funds, which constitutes direct assistance to Grantee as a beneficiary under the Final Rule, defined in the Program Schedule pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this MOU.

The term of this MOU will run from the Effective Date until the expiration of the Program outlined in the Program Schedule.



GENERAL TERMS

ARTICLE 1. ALLOCATION AMOUNT AND PERMISSIBLE USES OF FUNDS

The amount of ARPA Funds allocated to Grantee pursuant to this MOU and the purposes for which they may be used are set forth in the relevant Program Schedule. DOA's contribution to the total cost of eligible expenditures reported by a Grantee under this MOU shall not exceed the amount set forth in the relevant Program Schedule. DOA shall not reimburse any costs that are not eligible for reimbursement under ARPA or rules, regulations, or guidance promulgated to implement ARPA.

ARTICLE 2. PAYMENT

Reimbursements shall be made as provided in the relevant Program Schedule. Grantee is solely responsible for demonstrating that expenditures submitted for reimbursement meet the eligibility requirements set forth in the relevant Program Schedule, and for ensuring that any funds disbursed to Grantee are allocated within the Grantee's affiliated local or Tribal government in accordance with any applicable local or Tribal requirements.

ARTICLE 3. REPORTING

Grantee shall provide DOA with all information necessary to comply with all requirements of the Treasury Department and other federal agencies regarding reporting of the uses of ARPA Funds. Grantee will also provide DOA with all information necessary to accomplish any public transparency reporting or Grantee monitoring that DOA deems necessary. Further reporting requirements are outlined in the Program Schedule.

ARTICLE 4. APPLICABLE LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS

This MOU shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wisconsin and the laws of the United States, including without limitation ARPA, the Final Rule, and all other rules and regulations promulgated to implement ARPA. Grantee shall be responsible for ensuring that its uses of the ARPA Funds allocated to it under this MOU comply with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

ARTICLE 5. NONDISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION REQUIREMENTS

In connection with the performance of work under this MOU, Grantee agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, religion, color, handicap, sex, physical condition, developmental disability as defined in Wis. Stat. s. 51.01 (5), sexual orientation or national origin except as otherwise permitted by law. This is with respect to, but is not limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. Except with respect to sexual orientation, Grantee further agrees to take affirmative action to ensure equal employment opportunities. Grantee agrees to post in conspicuous places, available for employees and applicants for employment, notices required by law.

Pursuant to 2019 Wisconsin Executive Order 1, Grantee agrees it will hire only on the basis of merit and will not discriminate against any persons performing a contract, subcontract or grant because of military or veteran status, gender identity or expression, marital or familial status, genetic information or political affiliation.

Failure to comply with the conditions of this article may result in the declaration of Grantee ineligibility, the termination of this MOU, or the withholding of funds.

ARTICLE 6. COMPLIANCE BY THIRD-PARTY RECIPIENTS OF FUNDS

If, and to the extent that, the Program Schedule allows Grantee to award funds to third parties, Grantee shall be responsible for ensuring that any third party receiving funds pursuant to the Program complies with all laws, rules, and regulations applicable to the use of those funds by the third party.

ARTICLE 7. SUBLET OR ASSIGNMENT OF DUTIES

Grantee shall not sublet or assign all or any part of Grantee's duties or rights under this MOU without prior written approval of DOA.

ARTICLE 8. REIMBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

Grantee shall return to DOA any funds paid to Grantee in excess of the amount allocated pursuant to this MOU. If Grantee fails to return excess funds, DOA may deduct the appropriate amount from subsequent payments due to Grantee from DOA. DOA also reserves the right to recover such funds by any other legal means.

Grantee shall be responsible for reimbursement to DOA for any disbursed funds DOA determines have been misused or misappropriated. Any reimbursement of funds required by DOA shall be due upon DOA's written demand to Grantee.

ARTICLE 9. INDEMNIFICATION

In carrying out the provisions of this MOU or in exercising any power or authority contracted to Grantee thereby, there shall be no personal liability upon the State, it being understood that in such matters the Division and the Department act as agents and representatives of the State.

Grantee shall indemnify and hold harmless the State and all of its officers, agents and employees from all suits, actions or claims of any character brought for or on account of any injuries or damages received by any persons or property resulting from the operations of Grantee, or of any of its agents or sub-Grantees, in performing work under this MOU.

Grantee shall indemnify and hold harmless the State and all of its officers, agents and employees from all suits, actions or claims of any character brought for or on account of any obligations arising out of agreements between Grantee and third parties to perform services or otherwise supply products or services. Grantee shall also hold the State harmless for any audit disallowance related to the allocation of administrative costs under this MOU, irrespective of whether the audit is ordered by a federal or state agency or by a court.

ARTICLE 10. FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Grantee's chart of accounts and accounting system shall permit timely preparation of reports of expenditures as required by DOA.

Records shall be maintained for a period of not less than five years unless the Program requirements are longer.

ARTICLE 11. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST AND ETHICS

No person who is an employee, agent, consultant, or officer of Grantee, or an elected or appointed official, and who exercises or has exercised any functions or responsibilities with respect to activities supported by and described in this MOU, or who is in a position to participate in a decision making process or gain inside information with regard to such activities, may obtain a personal or financial interest or benefit from the activity, or have an interest in any agreement or subcontract with respect thereto or the proceeds thereunder, either for themselves or those with whom they have family or business ties, during their tenure. Receipt of earnings from Grantee by employees of Grantee shall not be considered a conflict of interest, but otherwise employees of Grantee shall be fully bound by the requirements of this Article. Upon request, DOA can make exceptions to this requirement after full disclosure and where DOA determines that such exception is in the best interests of the State and is not contrary to state or federal laws.

Grantee agrees to disclose to DOA in writing any potential conflict of interest affecting the awarded funds so it can determine its own disclosure obligations to the Treasury Department in accordance with Treasury Department policy.

Grantee, its agents and employees shall observe all relevant provisions of the Ethics Code for Public Officials under Wis. Stat. ch. 19, subch. III, and the State Employee Code of Ethics, Wis. Admin. Code Ch. ER-MRS 24.

ARTICLE 12. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

DOA may terminate this MOU at any time with or without cause by delivering notice to Grantee.

ARTICLE 13. AMENDMENT

This MOU may be amended by mutual consent of the parties. Amendments shall be in writing and signed by the parties. Changes to the amount of funds allocated under this MOU or the purposes for which those funds may be used may be documented by amending the relevant Program Schedule.

ARTICLE 14. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this MOU shall be adjudged to be unlawful, then that provision shall be deemed null and void and severable from the remaining provisions and shall in no way affect the validity of this MOU.

ARTICLE 15. SURVIVAL OF REQUIREMENTS

Unless otherwise authorized in writing by DOA, the terms and conditions of this MOU shall survive the Performance Period and shall continue in full force and effect until Grantee has completed and is in compliance with all the requirements of this MOU.

ARTICLE 16. EXAMINATION OF RECORDS

DOA, or any of its authorized representatives, shall have access to and the right at any time to examine, audit, excerpt, transcribe, and copy on Grantee's premises any directly pertinent records and computer files of Grantee involving transactions relating to this MOU. If the material is held in an automated format, Grantee shall provide copies of these materials in the automated format or such computer file as may be requested by DOA. Such material shall be retained until such time as DOA notifies otherwise.

This provision shall also apply in the event of cancellation or termination of this MOU. Grantee shall notify DOA in writing of any planned conversion or destruction of these materials at least 90 days prior to such action. Any charges for copies provided by Grantee of books, documents, papers, records, computer files or computer printouts shall not exceed the actual cost thereof to Grantee and shall be reimbursed by DOA.

ARTICLE 17. LOBBYING

Funds provided to Grantee pursuant to this MOU may not be used to influence federal contracting or financial transactions.

PROGRAM SCHEDULE

TRIBAL AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY INITIATIVE

This Program Schedule outlining the Tribal and Local Law Enforcement Agency Initiative (the “Program”) is attached to and incorporated into the Memorandum of Understanding Regarding Use of ARPA Funds (“MOU”) between DOA and Grantee.

Award Amounts and Permissible Uses:

Program: Tribal and Local Law Enforcement Agency Initiative

Award Amount: Each tribal and local law enforcement agency in the State of Wisconsin (referred to herein as “LEAs” or “Grantees”) has been allocated a certain sum (its “Allocation”) based on the size of the population it serves, with an add-on for LEAs serving communities where violent crime exceeds the state average. The Allocation for each LEA is available on the program website (<https://doa.wi.gov/Pages/LocalGovtsGrants/leagrant.aspx>) and incorporated by reference herein.

Program Duration: An LEA may use its Allocation to reimburse eligible expenditures incurred **between March 15, 2022 and June 30, 2023**. Expenditures incurred outside that time window are not eligible for reimbursement under this Program. For purposes of this Program, an expenditure is not “incurred” until the LEA or its affiliated Tribal or local government has paid it.

How it Works: During a quarterly Reporting Period, an LEA may draw down its Allocation and receive allocated funds by reporting eligible expenditures for reimbursement through the Program’s online reporting system. DOA will process these submissions and reimburse each LEA’s reported eligible expenditures from the remaining balance of its Allocation. The first Reporting Period is expected to occur during a two-week period in September 2022; they will occur on a quarterly basis thereafter until the completion of the Program.

Example: An LEA has a \$20,000 allocation. During the September 2022 Reporting Period, it uses the online reporting system to report \$8,000 in eligible expenditures incurred since March 15, 2022. DOA processes the reimbursement request and pays \$8,000 to the LEA, leaving \$12,000 in the LEA’s Allocation. In the next quarterly Reporting Period, the LEA submits another \$7,000 in eligible expenditures. Those eligible expenditures are again processed and reimbursed, leaving the LEA with \$5,000 of its Allocation remaining to reimburse expenditures reported in subsequent Reporting Periods.

Permitted Uses of Funds: The Program is intended to provide LEAs with additional resources to help offset certain costs associated with hiring, training, testing, and equipping law-enforcement officers, as well as updating certain technology and policies and implementing new crime-reduction initiatives. The following expenditures are eligible for reimbursement under the Program, subject to the limitations set forth in the MOU, this Program Schedule, and applicable state and federal law:

- 1. Recruitment incentives.** The Program will reimburse the costs of certain financial incentives to recruit new officers, jail personnel, and dispatchers (referred to collectively below as “new hires”), as follows:
 - a.** The costs of a new hire’s academy or other formal preparatory training, to the extent the new hire’s training costs are reimbursed by the LEA following acceptance of employment.
 - b.** A signing bonus of up to \$2,000 for each new hire.
 - c.** For each new hire whose most recent employer was an out-of-state governmental agency, an additional bonus of up to \$500 for each year of relevant out-of-state experience as a law enforcement officer, jailer, or dispatcher, up to an additional \$2,000. Thus, for a new hire from an out-of-state law governmental agency with four or more years’ relevant experience, this Program will reimburse the cost of providing a signing bonus of up to \$4,000.

Each new hire who receives recruitment incentives that are reimbursed through this Program must provide the LEA with a written statement affirming that the new hire intends to complete at least three years' continuous employment with the LEA. The LEA is responsible for collecting and maintaining those statements; it does not need to provide copies of those statements when making reimbursement requests unless specifically requested by DOA.

Each LEA is responsible for conducting appropriate background checks on employment candidates. New hires with a record of misconduct are not eligible to receive recruitment incentives that are reimbursed through this Program.

2. **Medical testing.** The Program will reimburse the costs of job-related medical testing of officers, including physical examinations, hearing tests, drug tests, pre-employment psychological examinations, and other medical testing.
3. **Training.** The Program will reimburse the costs of providing training to help reduce violence and improve community safety, including programs to train officers in any of the following subject areas:
 - a. Crisis intervention, including training for interactions with individuals suffering from mental illness and addiction.
 - b. Resiliency and suicide prevention.
 - c. Use-of-force options and de-escalation tactics, including scenario-based training aimed at stabilizing potentially dangerous situations to allow more time and options for safe resolution.
 - d. Implicit bias.
 - e. "Active bystander" training.
 - f. The emergency detention process.
 - g. Homicide investigation.
 - h. Any annual recertification training required by the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Standards Board.
4. **Wellness and counseling programs.** The Program will reimburse the costs of providing wellness, counseling, or behavioral health programs or services to officers.
5. **Officer equipment, fuel, and technology, excluding weapons.** The Program will reimburse the costs of purchasing the following:
 - a. Uniforms, duty belts, holsters, handcuffs, boots, bulletproof vests and other protective gear, radios, flashlights, and other equipment of a similar nature.
 - b. License-plate readers, security cameras, and smart cameras, including thermal imaging cameras and vehicle-mounted cameras.
 - c. Mobile data computers and equipment purchased for the purpose of improving wireless connectivity in LEA vehicles, such as mobile hot spots.
 - d. Body cameras and body camera-activating holsters.
 - e. Upgrades to public safety answering point (PSAP) systems or infrastructure.
 - f. Any accessories, software, services (including installation), or specialized training needed to utilize items in categories 5.a to 5.e above.
 - g. Up to 50 percent of the fuel and charging costs for LEA vehicles.

Weapons (including non-lethal weapons) and ammunition are not eligible for reimbursement through this Program.

6. **Temporary contract personnel.** The Program will reimburse the costs of retaining temporary contract personnel to assist with processing evidence, reducing backlogs, or other tasks that help LEAs conduct criminal investigations. When reporting these expenditures in the online reporting system, the LEA must identify the contractor used and the nature of the services performed.
7. **Sworn law enforcement officers, jail personnel, and dispatchers.** The Program will reimburse certain costs associated with sworn law enforcement officers, as follows:

- a. The additional payroll costs associated with increasing part-time officers, dispatchers, or jail personnel to full-time positions.
 - b. For LEAs that adopt or engage in initiatives to reduce violent crime (including offenses involving firearms), the payroll costs of officers for time worked on such initiatives.
 - c. The payroll costs of officers for time worked on Crisis Intervention Teams.
 - d. For LEAs serving communities where the violent crime rate exceeds the state average, as identified in Appendix 1, the full payroll costs for new hires (as defined in paragraph 1 above) made on or after March 15, 2022.
8. **K9 units.** The Program will reimburse the costs associated with purchasing canines to assist officers with law enforcement functions, including any related training costs.
9. **Community policing initiatives.** The Program will reimburse costs associated with designing and implementing community policing initiatives, including training, equipment and technology (excluding weapons), temporary contract personnel, or other expenses associated with such initiatives. For purposes of this Program, “community policing initiatives” refer to place-based, community-oriented crime reduction strategies in targeted neighborhoods suffering from chronic crime issues.
10. **Initiatives to address carjacking and vehicle theft.** The Program will reimburse costs associated with designing and implementing initiatives to prevent and investigate incidents of carjacking and vehicle theft, including training, equipment and technology (excluding weapons), temporary contract personnel, or other expenses associated with such initiatives.
11. **Updating use-of-force policies to comply with Act 75.** The Program will reimburse costs associated with updating their use-of-force policies to comply with the standards set forth in [2021 Wisconsin Act 75](#), including any costs of training related to these standards.

Expenditures not included in the above categories are not eligible for reimbursement through this Program.

Procurement limitations: All expenditures submitted for reimbursement through this Program must comply with Grantee’s local procurement procedures and must avoid conflicts of interest, acquisition of unnecessary or duplicative items, excessive costs, or other waste.

Payments:

Grantee shall make requests for reimbursement payments by reporting eligible expenditures through DOA’s online reporting system during Reporting Periods.

Reimbursement payments shall only be made after the MOU has been fully executed by Grantee and DOA, the Grantee has reported expenses that are eligible for reimbursement in compliance with the MOU and this Program Schedule, and responses are provided by Grantee for any questions from DOA within timeframes designated by DOA.

DOA shall make payment by check or via Automated Clearing House (ACH).

Payments to Grantee that exceed allowable expenses pursuant to the terms of the Agreement, if outstanding at the expiration of this Agreement, shall be repaid to DOA within 60 days of the expiration date of the Performance Period. DOA, in accordance with State procedures, shall reconcile payments and report expenses.

Records and Reporting:

Grantee is responsible for maintaining records sufficient to demonstrate that the expenditures submitted for reimbursement are eligible expenditures under the MOU and this Program Schedule. Grantee will cooperate with

any inquiry and provide any relevant information or records requested by DOA or any of its authorized representatives relating to the expenditures submitted for reimbursement.

Grantee understands that DOA is required to submit quarterly and annual reports to the U.S. Department of Treasury pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Grantee shall timely provide DOA with all information that may be necessary to comply with those reporting requirements.

Grantee must retain records for a period of at least five years after all ARPA State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provided by the Department of Treasury to the State of Wisconsin have been expended or returned to the federal government. Current law requires the State to expend or return such funds no later than December 31, 2026.

Administration:

The DOA employee responsible for the administration of this MOU with respect to this Program Schedule shall be DOA's Administrator of the Division of Intergovernmental Relations or their designee, who shall represent DOA's interest in review of quality, quantity, rate of progress, timeliness, compliance, federal reporting, and related considerations as outlined in this MOU.

The Grantee employee responsible for the administration of this MOU with respect to this Program Schedule shall be the person designated as "contact person" by Grantee, who shall represent Grantee's interest regarding Agreement performance, financial records, and related considerations. DOA shall be immediately notified of any change of this designee.

- (5) That the Grantee is not a federally debarred contractor and is not on the list of parties excluded from federal procurement and non-procurement contracts.

WHEREAS, \$325,000 has been requested as part of the 2023 Police Department Operating Budget for squad cars and the necessary accessories to outfit them for use; and additionally, \$75,000 has been previously approved as part of the 2022 Capital Improvement Budget for investigative vehicles and necessary accessories to outfit them for use; and the West Allis Police Department has confirmed with the Finance Department the receipt of \$40,000 from Cities and Villages Mutual Insurance Company for a West Allis Police Department marked squad car that was recently involved in a motor vehicle crash resulting in a total loss requiring replacement; and that this \$40,000 is available to the West Allis Police Department to replace this vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the West Allis Police Department has sufficient funds available through its Federal Equitable Sharing Account to pay the difference between the amount requested and the total cost of vehicles and set-up; and

WHEREAS, the vehicle fleet for the West Allis Police Department requires consistent rotation to ensure adequate police services; the current fleet of investigative vehicles is two short of optimal and has been for several years; the most current vehicle in the investigative vehicle fleet is over 11 years old; that the investigative vehicle fleet is reaching end of life; the procurement of these investigative vehicles will allow the Police Department to begin a consistent and timely rotation among the fleet; and the delay in ordering may lead to a delay in receipt of investigative and patrol vehicles until 2024; and

WHEREAS, National Auto Fleet Group has a national Sourcewell Contract for the purchase of vehicles and in conjunction with the City of West Allis Purchasing Division, the Police Department has determined this contract is within City purchasing guidelines and is similar to the State of Wisconsin purchasing contract; and

WHEREAS, National Auto Fleet Group has provided pricing for 2023 police-issue government vehicles, and the cost of a 2023 AWD Ford Police Interceptor Utility is approximately \$48,000; and the cost of the associated ancillary items including but not limited to light bars, sirens, and other equipment for these vehicles is approximately \$14,000 for a patrol vehicle and \$5,000 for an investigative vehicle; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 budget has not yet been approved, and the Police Department is requesting approval for this purchase to ensure proper and timely rotation of the Police Department vehicle fleet, if funding for this order is not appropriated and budgeted for 2023, the City will Notify National Auto Fleet Group as soon as possible to modify or terminate this order based on actual appropriations, as payment for these vehicles is not made until the Police Department receives these vehicles, and receipt of these vehicles is not anticipated until 2023; and

WHEREAS, the purchase of 2 investigative vehicles received approval by the West Allis Police and Fire Commission at the Board of Police and Fire Commission meeting on August 18th, 2022; and an approval request for the purchase of 6 additional vehicles is scheduled for review by the Board of Police and Fire Commission on September 15th, 2022.

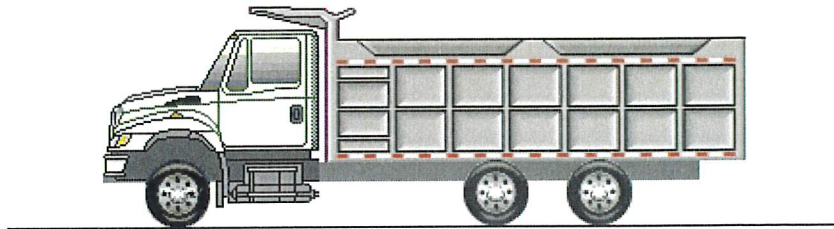

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A DS450 BALLOT SCANNER

WHEREAS, the City of West Allis has established a Central Count for the counting of absentee ballots, and;

WHEREAS, the number of absentee ballots requested and cast during the pandemic was unprecedented and remains at a high level, and;

WHEREAS, the ability to process ballots timely is based on the number of election inspectors, their abilities, and the equipment employed in the process, and;

WHEREAS, the City of West Allis currently uses DS200 Ballot Scanners in Central Count and each polling location, and;

WHEREAS, the DS200 Ballot Scanner processes eleven ballots per minute, which is an acceptable rate for the polling places, but not central count especially in elections with larger turnout; and,

WHEREAS, the City of West Allis has the opportunity to purchase a DS450 scanner no longer used by the City of New Berlin because they eliminated central count, and;

WHEREAS, a DS450 Ballot Scanner can scan seventy-two ballots per minute almost seven times faster than the DS200, and it also separates ballots with write-ins to eliminate the need to review all of the ballots for write-ins at the end of the night, and;

WHEREAS, purchasing the DS450 will allow deployment of more DS200s to the polling places increasing the efficiency of end of night duties.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Common Council of the City of West Allis that the City Administrator is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the purchase of the DS450 from New Berlin for an amount not to exceed \$39,000. The Capital Equipment fund will be used to fund the purchase and annual maintenance costs will be included in the City Clerk budget.

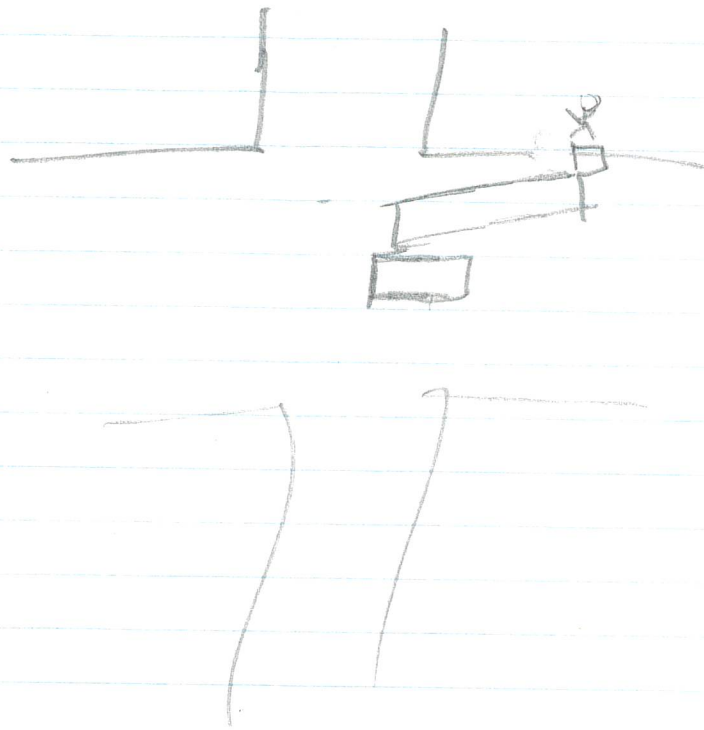



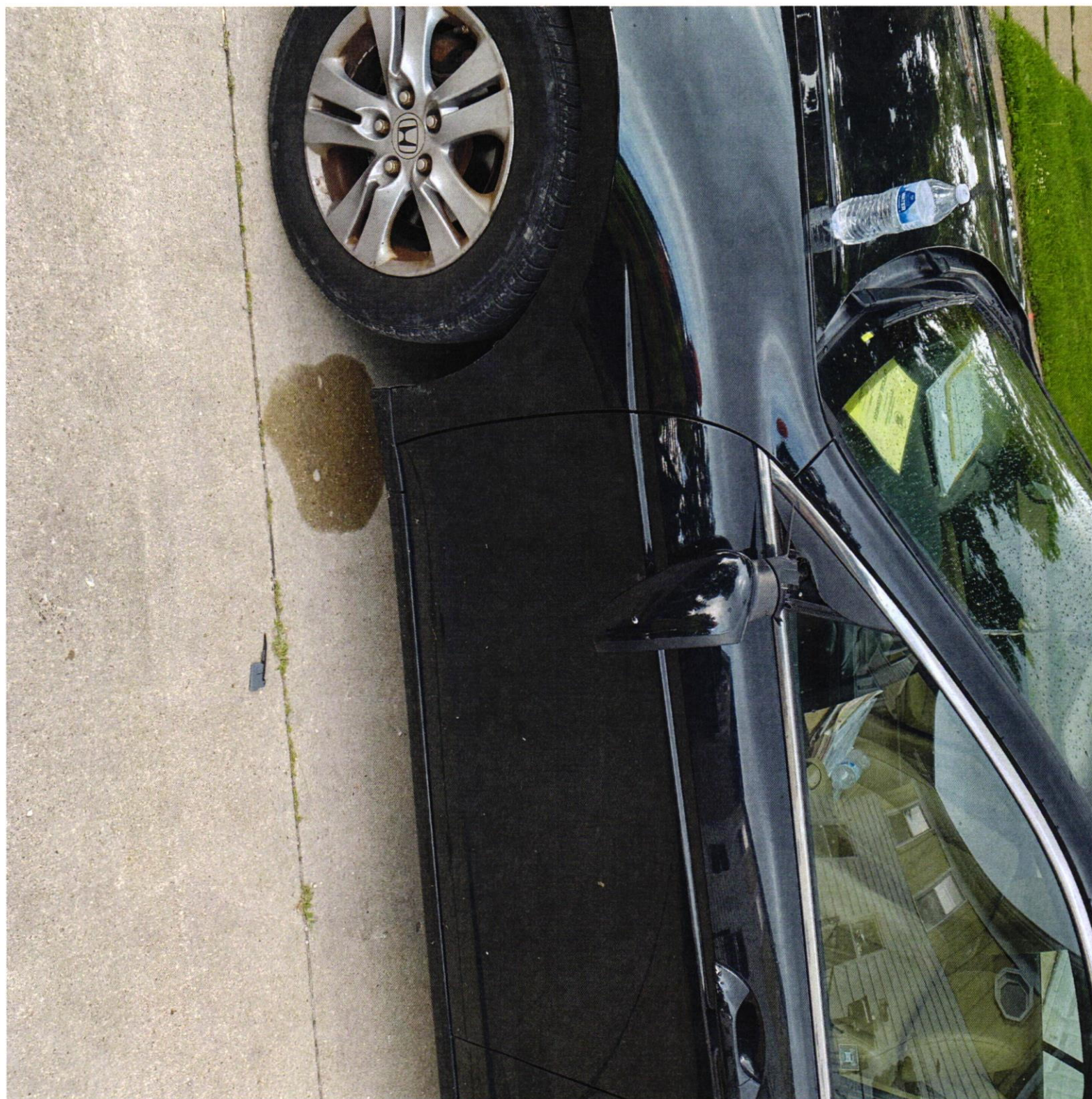

7. Charges to Borrower and Protection of Lender's Rights in the Property. Borrower shall pay all governmental or municipal charges, fines and impositions that are not included in paragraph 2. Borrower shall pay these obligations on time directly to the entity which is owed the payment. If failure to pay would adversely affect Lender's interest in the Property, upon Lender's request Borrower shall promptly furnish to Lender receipts evidencing these payments.

If Borrower fails to make these payments or the payments required by paragraph 2, or fails to perform any other covenants and agreements contained in this Security Instrument, or there is a legal proceeding that may significantly affect Lender's rights in the Property (such as a proceeding in bankruptcy, for condemnation or to enforce laws or regulations), then Lender may do and pay whatever is necessary to protect the value of the Property and Lender's rights in the Property, including payment of taxes, hazard insurance and other items mentioned in paragraph 2.

Any amounts disbursed by Lender under this paragraph shall become an additional debt of Borrower and be secured by this Security Instrument. These amounts shall bear interest from the date of disbursement at the Note rate, and at the option of Lender shall be immediately due and payable.

Borrower shall promptly discharge any lien which has priority over this Security Instrument unless Borrower (a) agrees in writing to the payment of the obligation secured by the lien in a manner acceptable to Lender, (b) contests in good faith the lien by, or defends against enforcement of the lien in, legal proceedings which in the Lender's opinion operate to prevent the enforcement of the lien, or (c) secures from the holder of the lien an agreement satisfactory to Lender subordinating the lien to this Security Instrument. If Lender determines that any part of the Property is subject to a lien which may attain priority over this Security Instrument, Lender may give Borrower a notice identifying the lien. Borrower shall satisfy the lien or take one or more of the actions set forth above within 10 days of the giving of notice.

8. Fees. Lender may collect fees and charges authorized by the Secretary.

9. Grounds for Acceleration of Debt.

(a) Default. Lender may, except as limited by regulations issued by the Secretary in the case of payment defaults, require immediate payment in full of all sums secured by this Security Instrument if

(i) Borrower defaults by failing to pay in full any monthly payment required by this Security Instrument prior to or on the due date of the next monthly payment, or

(ii) Borrower defaults by failing, for a period of thirty days, to perform any other obligations contained in this Security Instrument.

(b) Sale Without Credit Approval. Lender shall, if permitted by applicable law (including section 341(d) of the Garn-St Germain Depository Institutions Act of 1982, 12 U.S.C. 1701j-3(d)) and with the prior approval of the Secretary, require immediate payment in full of all sums secured by this Security Instrument if

(i) All or part of the Property, or a beneficial interest in a trust owning all or part of the Property, is sold or otherwise transferred (other than by devise or descent), and

(ii) The Property is not occupied by the purchaser or grantee as his or her principal residence, or the purchaser or grantee does so occupy the Property, but his or her credit has not been approved in accordance with the requirements of the Secretary.

(c) No Waiver. If circumstances occur that would permit Lender to require immediate payment in full, but Lender does not require such payments, Lender does not waive its rights with respect to subsequent events.

(d) Regulations of HUD Secretary. In many circumstances regulations issued by the Secretary will limit Lender's rights, in the case of payment defaults, to require immediate payment in full and foreclose if not paid. This Security Instrument does not authorize acceleration or foreclosure if not permitted by regulations of the Secretary.

(e) Mortgage Not Insured. Borrower agrees that if this Security Instrument and the Note are not determined to be eligible for insurance under the National Housing Act within 90 days from the date hereof, Lender may, at its option require immediate payment in full of all sums secured by this Security Instrument. A written statement of any authorized agent of the Secretary dated subsequent to 90 days from the date hereof, declining to insure this Security Instrument and the Note, shall be deemed conclusive proof of such ineligibility. Notwithstanding the foregoing, this option may not be exercised by Lender when the unavailability of insurance is solely due to Lender's failure to remit a mortgage insurance premium to the Secretary.

10. Reinstatement. Borrower has a right to be reinstated if Lender has required immediate payment in full because of Borrower's failure to pay an amount due under the Note or this Security Instrument. This right applies even after foreclosure proceedings are instituted. To reinstate the Security Instrument, Borrower shall tender in a lump sum all amounts required to bring Borrower's account current including, to the extent they are obligations of Borrower under this Security Instrument, foreclosure costs and reasonable and customary attorneys' fees and expenses properly associated with the foreclosure proceeding. Upon reinstatement by Borrower, this Security Instrument and the obligations that it secures shall remain in effect as if Lender had not required immediate payment in full. However, Lender is not required to permit reinstatement if (i) Lender has accepted reinstatement after the commencement of foreclosure proceedings within two years immediately preceding the commencement of a current foreclosure proceeding, (ii) reinstatement will preclude foreclosure on different grounds in the future, or (iii) reinstatement will adversely affect the priority of the lien created by this Security Instrument.

11. Borrower Not Released; Forbearance by Lender Not a Waiver. Extension of the time of payment or modification of amortization of the sums secured by this Security Instrument granted by Lender to any successor in interest of Borrower shall not operate to release the liability of the original Borrower or Borrower's successors in interest. Lender shall not be required to commence proceedings against any successor in interest or refuse to extend time for payment or otherwise modify amortization of the sums secured by this Security Instrument by reason of any demand made by the original Borrower or Borrower's successors in interest. Any forbearance by Lender in exercising any right or remedy shall not be a waiver of or preclude the exercise of any right or remedy.

12. Successors and Assigns Bound; Joint and Several Liability; Co-Signers. The covenants and agreements of this Security Instrument shall bind and benefit the successors and assigns of Lender and Borrower, subject to the provisions of paragraph 9(b). Borrower's covenants and agreements shall be joint and several. Any Borrower who co-signs this Security Instrument but does not execute the Note (a) is co-signing this Security Instrument only to mortgage, grant and convey that Borrower's interest in the Property under the terms of this Security Instrument, (b) is not personally obligated to pay the sums secured by this Security Instrument, and (c) agrees that Lender and any other Borrower may agree to extend, modify, forbear or make any accommodations with regard to the terms of this Security Instrument or the Note without that Borrower's consent.

13. Notices. Any notice to Borrower provided for in this Security Instrument shall be given by delivering it or by mailing it by first class mail unless applicable law requires use of another method. The notice shall be directed to the Property Address or any other address Borrower designates by notice to Lender. Any notice to Lender shall be given by first class mail to Lender's address stated herein or any address Lender designates by notice to Borrower. Any notice provided for in this Security Instrument shall be deemed to have been given to Borrower or Lender when given as provided in this paragraph.

14. Governing Law; Severability. This Security Instrument shall be governed by federal law and the law of the jurisdiction in which the Property is located. In the event that any provision or clause of this Security Instrument or the Note conflicts with applicable law, such conflict shall not affect other provisions of this Security Instrument or the Note which can be given effect without the conflicting provision. To this end the provisions of this Security Instrument and the Note are declared to be severable.

15. Borrower's Copy. Borrower shall be given one conformed copy of the Note and of this Security Instrument.

16. Hazardous Substances. Borrower shall not cause or permit the presence, use, disposal, storage, or release of any Hazardous Substances on or in the Property. Borrower shall not do, nor allow anyone else to do, anything affecting the Property that is in violation of any Environmental Law. The preceding two sentences shall not apply to the presence, use, or storage on the Property of small quantities of Hazardous Substances that are generally recognized to be appropriate to normal residential uses and to maintenance of the Property.

Borrower shall promptly give Lender written notice of any investigation, claim, demand, lawsuit or other action by any governmental or regulatory agency or private party involving the Property and any Hazardous Substance or Environmental Law of which Borrower has actual knowledge. If Borrower learns, or is notified by any governmental or regulatory authority, that any removal or other remediation of any Hazardous Substances affecting the Property is necessary, Borrower shall promptly take all necessary remedial actions in accordance with Environmental Law.

As used in this paragraph 16 "Hazardous Substances" are those substances defined as toxic or hazardous substances by Environmental Law and the following substances: gasoline, kerosene, other flammable or toxic petroleum products, toxic pesticides and herbicides, volatile solvents, materials containing asbestos or formaldehyde, and radioactive materials. As used in this paragraph 16, "Environmental Law" means federal laws and laws of the jurisdiction where the Property is located that relate to health, safety or environmental protection.

NON-UNIFORM COVENANTS Borrower and Lender further covenant and agree as follows

17. Assignment of Rents. Borrower unconditionally assigns and transfers to Lender all the rents and revenues of the Property. Borrower authorizes Lender or Lender's agents to collect the rents and revenues and hereby directs each tenant of the Property to pay the rents to Lender or Lender's agents. However, prior to Lender's notice to Borrower of Borrower's breach of any covenant or agreement in the Security Instrument, Borrower shall collect and receive all rents and revenues of the Property as trustee for the

benefit of Lender and Borrower. This assignment of rents constitutes an absolute assignment and not an assignment for additional security only.

If Lender gives notice of breach to Borrower (a) all rents received by Borrower shall be held by Borrower as trustee for benefit of Lender only, to be applied to the sums secured by the Security Instrument, (b) Lender shall be entitled to collect and receive all of the rents of the Property, and (c) each tenant of the Property shall pay all rents due and unpaid to Lender or Lender's agent on Lender's written demand to the tenant.

Borrower has not executed any prior assignment of the rents and has not and will not perform any act that would prevent Lender from exercising its rights under this paragraph 17.

Lender shall not be required to enter upon, take control of or maintain the Property before or after giving notice of breach to Borrower. However, Lender or a judicially appointed receiver may do so at any time there is a breach. Any application of rents shall not cure or waive any default or invalidate any other right or remedy of Lender. This assignment of rents of the Property shall terminate when the debt secured by the Security Instrument is paid in full.

18. Foreclosure Procedure. If Lender requires immediate payment in full under paragraph 9, Lender may invoke the power of sale and any other remedies permitted by applicable law. Lender shall be entitled to collect all expenses incurred in pursuing the remedies provided in this paragraph 18, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of title evidence.

If Lender invokes the power of sale, Lender shall give notice of sale in the manner prescribed by applicable law to Borrower and to the other persons prescribed by applicable law. Lender shall publish the notice of sale, and the Property shall be sold in the manner prescribed by applicable law. Lender or its designee may purchase the Property at any sale. The proceeds of the sale shall be applied in the following order: (a) to all expenses of the sale, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees, (b) to all sums secured by this Security Instrument, and (c) any excess to the clerk of the circuit court of the county in which the sale is held.

If the Lender's interest in this Security Instrument is held by the Secretary and the Secretary requires immediate payment in full under paragraph 9, the Secretary may invoke the nonjudicial power of sale provided in the Single Family Mortgage Foreclosure Act of 1994 ("Act") (12 U.S.C. 3751 et seq.) by requesting a foreclosure commissioner designated under the Act to commence foreclosure and to sell the Property as provided in the Act. Nothing in the preceding sentence shall deprive the Secretary of any rights otherwise available to a Lender under this paragraph 18 or applicable law.

19. Release. Upon payment of all sums secured by this Security Instrument, Lender shall release this Security Instrument without charge to Borrower. Borrower shall pay any recordation costs.

20. Accelerated Redemption Periods. If (a) the Property is 20 acres or less in size, (b) Lender in an action to foreclose this Security Instrument waives all right to a judgment for deficiency and (c) Lender consents to Borrower's remaining in possession of the Property, then the sale of Property may be 6 months from the date the judgment is entered if the Property is owner-occupied at the time of the commencement of the foreclosure action. If conditions (b) and (c) above are met and the Property is not owner-occupied at the time of the commencement of the foreclosure action, then the sale of the Property may be 3 months from the date the judgment is entered. In any event, if the Property has been abandoned, then the sale of the Property may be 2 months from the date the judgment is entered.

21. Attorney's Fees. If this Security Instrument is subject to Chapter 428 of the Wisconsin Statutes, "reasonable attorneys' fees" shall mean only those attorneys' fees allowed by that Chapter.

22. Riders to this Security Instrument. If one or more riders are executed by Borrower and recorded together with this Security Instrument, the covenants of each such rider shall be incorporated into and shall amend and supplement the covenants and agreements of this Security Instrument as if the rider(s) were a part of this Security Instrument.



Foreclosure Mediation Program

Notice of Availability of Mediation

What is the foreclosure mediation program?

Your county's Foreclosure Mediation Program (the Program) is administered by Metro Milwaukee Mediation Services, Inc. (MMMS) and is part of the Wisconsin Foreclosure Mediation Network (WFMN). This Program has the support of your County Circuit Court.

The Program is available to assist homeowners facing a mortgage foreclosure action filed in County Circuit Court. Mediation is a confidential and voluntary process where you and the lender seeking to foreclose on your home may discuss ways to resolve your foreclosure case, including reinstatement of the loan and possible modification of the loan terms.

The Program is available to parties to a first or second mortgage foreclosure action involving a one-to-four family residential property. You need not reside in the property, but you may not own more than four other rental properties. In addition, the action must be pending in County Circuit Court. Vacation properties or "seasonal homes" are not eligible, nor are homes under bankruptcy protection.

How does the homeowner request foreclosure mediation?

Along with this notice, you have received the Mediation Request Form. This form is also available through your local Clerk of Circuit Courts website and at <http://MediateWisconsin.com>. You should complete and send your request form to the program within 20 days of receiving the summons, but if that date has passed, you can still make a late request, as mediation might still be a possibility.

Within two business days of receiving the Mediation Request Form, the Program Administrator will refer a housing counseling agency or documents specialist to you via mail or email. Your second step is to contact your housing counselor or documents specialist to set up a meeting for compiling a complete loan modification application. Once complete, the housing counselor or documents specialist sends the loan modification application directly to the Program Administrator. Your third step is to pay the Program fee by mailing your check or money order to MMMS at P.O. Box 633, Milwaukee, WI 53201 or by calling our office at 414-939-8800 or toll-free at 877-721-6262 with your credit card payment.

After you have completed all three mediation request steps, the Program Administrator will notify your lender to request their participation, seeking a response within 10 business days. Your Lender's non-refundable mediation fee of \$300 is due at the time of their consent.

Is participation in mediation required?

Participation is voluntary for the homeowner/borrower and lender. Sometimes, lenders will choose not to participate in mediation, particularly when prior refinances/modifications didn't work out.

While entry into the Foreclosure Mediation Program is voluntary for both parties, by consenting, the parties agree to abide by the process set forth in the court's local rules.

If the Lender declines the invitation to mediate, the Program Administrator will refund all but \$50 of your mediation application fee. The \$50 is non-refundable and used to off-set program administrative costs. If the Lender agrees to mediate, the entire fee is non-refundable.

How can the Housing Counselor help?

To increase the chance of success at mediation, you are matched with a housing counselor or documents specialist in your area. Housing Counselors are specially trained and certified to go over financial information with you, and to discuss programs that may be available to avoid foreclosure. Documents Specialists are specially trained to help you compile the forms and documentation necessary to submit a complete financial documents package to your mortgage servicer. If you do not take this step, the mediation cannot proceed.

What does mediation cost?

There is no cost to request mediation or to work with a housing counselor/documents specialist. You and your lender must each pay a non-refundable Program fee before the case can be scheduled for mediation. The homeowner fee for cases involving Milwaukee County properties is \$100 and for all other counties administered by MMMS, the fee is \$200. The Lender fee for all cases administered by MMMS is \$300. To make your payment you may mail a check or money order to MMMS, P.O. Box 633, Milwaukee, WI 53201. You may also pay with credit or debit card by phone at 414-939-8800 or toll-free at 877-721-6262.

Does the foreclosure stop during the mediation process?

Even after applying for mediation, you are required to comply with all mandatory deadlines set by the court, including the time to answer the Complaint. Please read the Summons and Complaint *carefully* and make sure you understand your rights and the time-period for filing an Answer or Responsive Pleading. If you do not file an Answer or Responsive Pleading, the court may grant judgment against you and you may lose your right to object to anything that you disagree with in the Complaint.

Do you need a lawyer to participate in the mediation program?

While everyone is always strongly encouraged to consult with an attorney, you are not required to be represented by an attorney.

You may contact the statewide Lawyer Referral and Information Service at (800) 362-9082 to obtain the names of attorneys who may be able to assist you. You may also try the following legal aid organizations based on geographic area: Wisconsin Judicare at (715) 842-1681; Legal Aid Society of Milwaukee at (414) 727-5300, and Legal Action of Wisconsin at (800) 236-1127. Income restrictions may apply.

If you are working with a lawyer, please notify the Program Administrator of their name and contact information.

Who must attend the mediation session?

The mediation session must be attended in person by all homeowners who signed the note. All attorneys must also attend in person or by video conference, if available. The loan servicer will attend by telephone. Either party may have other support persons such as attorneys, loan officers and tax advisers attend or available by phone.

ATTACHMENT A - SCOPE OF SERVICES

This is an attachment to the Agreement dated September 12, 2022 between the City of West Allis (OWNER) and TerraVenture Advisors (CONSULTANT).

ARTICLE 1 - BASIC SERVICES

1.1 General

- 1.1.1 CONSULTANT shall provide professional services for OWNER on the Project to which this Agreement applies, including professional consultation and advice, and duties and responsibilities as provided below.

1.2 Relocation Services

After written authorization to proceed, CONSULTANT shall:

- 1.2.1 Consult with OWNER to clarify and define OWNER's requirements for the Project and review available data provided by OWNER.
- 1.2.2 Advise OWNER as to the necessity of OWNER's providing or obtaining additional data or services.
- 1.2.3 Upon receipt of Signed Contract, CONSULTANT shall initiate contact with all potential parties of interest. Contact to include an introduction letter and to calendar interview appointments.
- 1.2.3.1 Upon contract approval, CONSULTANT will notify owner and tenant businesses of eligibility status and commence services, upon approval to do so by the OWNER. Any denial of eligibility will be provided by the OWNER.
- 1.2.3.2 Relocation Services to business owner(s) and tenant business(es) will be provided in accordance with the Wisconsin law, Uniform Act, federal code and the WisDOT REPM, if applicable, and will include:
- Preparation of *Determination of Supplemental Replacement Business or Farm Payment* for each eligible displacee to be submitted to OWNER for review and approval;
 - Presentation of relocation package to displacee(s) upon approval by OWNER;
 - Advisory services regarding relocation claims to the displacee(s);
 - Preparation of relocation claims and submittal to OWNER;
 - Upon approval of claims, coordinate payment request and payment to displacee(s);
 - Offer of advisory services with regard to re-establishment of business(es).
- 1.2.3.3 The relocation process, at times, must engage the services of outside contractors or consultants, for example, a moving consultant. If these services are necessary to provide relocation services, their invoices shall be billed directly to the OWNER. No outside contractor will be hired prior to approval from the OWNER.
- 1.2.3.4 A relocation diary will be maintained for each displacee.
- 1.2.3.5 A relocation file will be maintained for each displacee. The CONSULTANT will make reasonable efforts to ensure the completeness, accuracy and/or applicability of appraisal-

type information, sales, or other data given to the CONSULTANT from whatever sources are used.

All individual parcel files are considered to be the property of the OWNER and shall be turned over to the OWNER by the CONSULTANT upon completion of the project. The OWNER will then review the file(s) for completeness and request any corrections or clarifications (i.e., amendments, revisions, etc.) from the CONSULTANT deemed necessary to close out the file. The CONSULTANT agrees to make and submit any requested corrections or clarifications in a timely manner.

1.2.3.6 Administrative meetings with the City and/or other stakeholders as needed.

ARTICLE 2 - ADDITIONAL SERVICES

2.1 Services Requiring Authorization in Advance

If authorized in writing by OWNER, CONSULTANT shall furnish or obtain from others Additional Services as provided below. These services are not included as part of Basic Services and will be paid for by OWNER as indicated in Attachment C.

- 2.1.1 Services resulting from significant changes in the general scope, extent or character of the Project including, but not limited to, changes in size, complexity, OWNER's schedule, or method of financing; and revising previously accepted studies, reports, or documents when such revisions are required by changes in laws, rules, regulations, ordinances, codes or orders enacted subsequent to the preparation of such studies, reports or documents, or are due to any other causes beyond CONSULTANT's control.
- 2.1.2 Furnishing services of independent professional associates and subconsultants.
- 2.1.3 Services during out-of-town travel required of CONSULTANT other than visits to the site or OWNER's office as required by Basic Services.
- 2.1.4 Preparing to serve or serving as a consultant or witness for OWNER in any litigation, arbitration or other legal or administrative proceeding involving the Project.
- 2.1.5 Additional services in connection with the Project, including services which are to be furnished by OWNER as listed below, and services not otherwise provided for in this Agreement.
- 2.1.6 Assistance provided in the acquisition/relocation of off-premise signs.
- 2.1.7 Any residential relocation services

ARTICLE 3 - OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

OWNER shall do the following in a timely manner so as not to delay the services of CONSULTANT:

- 3.1 Designate in writing a person to act as OWNER's representative with respect to the services to be rendered under this Agreement. Such person shall have complete authority to transmit

instructions, receive information, interpret and define OWNER's policies and decisions with respect to CONSULTANT's services for the Project.

- 3.2 Provide all criteria and full information as to OWNER's requirements for the Project, including objectives and constraints, performance requirements, and budgetary limitations; and furnish copies of all standards which OWNER will require to be included in the Project.
- 3.3 Place at CONSULTANT's disposal all available pertinent information including previous reports and any other relevant data.
- 3.4 Furnish to CONSULTANT, as required for performance of CONSULTANT's Basic Services, the following, all of which CONSULTANT may use and rely upon in performing services under this Agreement:
 - 3.4.1 Data prepared by or services of others, including without limitation property appraisals, borings, probings and subsurface explorations, hydrographic surveys, laboratory tests and inspections of samples, materials and equipment; including appropriate professional interpretations.
 - 3.4.2 Environmental assessments, audits, investigations, and impact statements, and other relevant environmental or cultural studies.
 - 3.4.3 Property, boundary, easement, right-of-way, topographic and utility surveys.
 - 3.4.4 Property descriptions.
 - 3.4.5 Zoning, deed and other land use restrictions.
 - 3.4.6 Other special data or consultations not covered under Basic Services and Additional Services.
- 3.5 If required, arrange for access to and make all provisions for CONSULTANT to enter upon public and private property as required for CONSULTANT to perform services under this Agreement. If requested by OWNER, CONSULTANT shall provide an electronic version of the letter for OWNER to print on OWNER's letterhead.
- 3.6 Examine relocation package documents presented by CONSULTANT, obtain advice of an attorney, insurance counselor and other consultants as OWNER deems appropriate for such examination and render in writing decisions pertaining thereto within a reasonable time so as not to delay the services of CONSULTANT.
- 3.7 Furnish approvals and permits from all governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the Project and such approvals and consents from others as may be necessary for completion of the Project.
- 3.8 Provide such accounting, independent cost estimating, and insurance counseling services as may be required for the Project, and such legal services as OWNER may require or CONSULTANT may reasonably request with regard to legal issues pertaining to the Project.
- 3.9 Give prompt written notice to CONSULTANT whenever OWNER observes or otherwise becomes aware of a hazardous situation or any other development that affects the scope or

timing of CONSULTANT's services, or any defect or nonconformance in CONSULTANT's services.

- 3.10 Furnish, or direct CONSULTANT to provide, Additional Services as stipulated in paragraph 2.1 or other services as required.
- 3.11 Bear all costs incident to compliance with the requirements of Article 3.
- ~~3.12~~ CONSULTANT will send a letter of project introduction to the displacees within a month of award of this contract. This letter should be in advance of completed appraisal but not more than 2 months in advance of appraisal completion. The OWNER may choose to review this letter prior to sending at the OWNER's discretion.
- 3.13 Handle work associated with off-premise signs, however, CONSULTANT shall provide assistance if requested as described in Article 2.
- 3.14 Provide copies of legal descriptions of the acquisition areas to the CONSULTANT for all parcels shown at Attachment F if available.
- 3.15 If applicable, provide the CONSULTANT with: Construction Plans, Profiles and Cross Sections, Right of Way Plats, Design Study Report, Property Owners Address and Phone List, Agricultural and/or Environmental Impact Studies (upon request), Highway Access Maps (upon request).

ATTACHMENT B - PERIOD OF SERVICES

This is an attachment to the Agreement dated September 12, 2022 between the City of West Allis (OWNER) and TerraVenture Advisors, LLC (CONSULTANT).

ARTICLE 4 - PERIOD OF SERVICES

- 4.1 The provisions of this Article 4 and the compensation for CONSULTANT's services have been agreed to in anticipation of the orderly and continuous progress of the Project. CONSULTANT's obligation to render services hereunder will extend for a period which may reasonably be required, including extra work and required extensions thereto. If specific periods of time for rendering services are set forth or specific dates by which services are to be completed are provided below and if such dates are exceeded through no fault of CONSULTANT, compensation provided herein shall be subject to equitable adjustment.
- 4.2 The proposed relocation services will be completed as follows: CONSULTANT shall take all reasonable steps to provide timely services to the OWNER and the potential displacee(s). The schedule for completing this work is proposed as follows:

This timeframe assumes contracting is completed by September 12, 2022. Schedule will be adjusted accordingly if not completed by that date. The schedule and completion date will be adjusted accordingly if prompt response is not received from OWNER. Contract Completion date expected to be no later than 12/31/2026.

- 4.3 CONSULTANT's services under shall each be considered complete at the earlier of (1) the date when the submissions have been accepted by OWNER or (2) thirty days after the date when such submissions are delivered to OWNER, plus such additional time as may be considered reasonable for obtaining approval of governmental authorities having jurisdiction to approve the design of the Project or similar.
- 4.4 If OWNER has requested significant modifications or changes in the general scope, extent or character of the Project, the time of performance of CONSULTANT's services shall be adjusted equitably.
- 4.5 If OWNER fails to give prompt written authorization to proceed with any phase of services after completion of the immediately preceding phase, CONSULTANT may, after giving seven days' written notice to OWNER, suspend services under this Agreement.
- 4.6 OWNER shall be liable for all costs and damages incurred by CONSULTANT for delays caused in whole or in part by OWNER's interference with CONSULTANT's ability to provide services, including, but not limited to, OWNER's failure to provide specified facilities or information, or if CONSULTANT's services are extended by OWNER's actions or inactions for more than ninety days. OWNER agrees to indemnify and hold CONSULTANT harmless for any delays caused by OWNER. If delays are caused by unpredictable occurrences including, without limitation, terrorism, fires, floods, riots, strikes, unavailability of labor or materials, delays or defaults by suppliers of material or services, process shutdowns, acts of God or the public enemy, or acts or regulations of any governmental agency, the costs for services and schedule commitments shall be subject to change.

ATTACHMENT C - COMPENSATION AND PAYMENTS

This is an attachment to the Agreement dated September 12, 2022 between the City of West Allis (OWNER) and TerraVenture Advisors, LLC (CONSULTANT).

ARTICLE 5 - COMPENSATION AND PAYMENTS

5.1 Compensation for Services and Expenses

- 5.1.1 Basic Services. OWNER shall pay CONSULTANT for Basic Services set forth in Attachment A as follows:
 - 5.1.1.1 Actual cost of labor, overhead, profit and direct expenses, up to \$163,498.92 plus actual outside contractor costs.
 - 5.1.1.2 CONSULTANT may alter the distribution of compensation between individual phases of the work noted herein to be consistent with services actually rendered, but shall not exceed the total contract amount unless approved in writing by OWNER.
 - 5.1.1.3 The contract amount includes compensation for CONSULTANT's services and do not include any subconsultants or independent contractors.
- 5.1.2 Additional Services. OWNER shall pay CONSULTANT for Additional Services, if any, as follows, however, additional services shall only be provided upon a written amendment to this contract.
- 5.1.3 Reimbursable Expenses. OWNER shall pay CONSULTANT for all Reimbursable Expenses incurred in connection with services as follows: Direct charges as mentioned in 5.1.1.1.
 - 5.1.3.1 For Internal Reimbursable Expenses. An amount equal to the Project-related internal Reimbursable Expenses actually incurred or allocated by CONSULTANT.
- 5.1.4 Amounts Billed.
 - 5.1.4.1 Direct Labor Costs Times a Factor Services. The portion of the amounts billed for CONSULTANT's services which are related to services rendered on a Direct Labor Costs times a factor basis will be billed based on the applicable Direct Labor Costs for the cumulative hours charged to the Project during the billing period by CONSULTANT's employees multiplied by the above designated factor, plus Reimbursable Expenses and charges of CONSULTANT's independent professional associates and subconsultants.
- 5.1.5 Annual Adjustments. The Direct Labor Costs will be adjusted annually (as of January) and the factor applied to Direct Labor Costs and the Reimbursable Expenses Schedule will be adjusted annually (as of May) to reflect equitable changes in the compensation payable to CONSULTANT.
- 5.1.6 Other Provisions Concerning Compensation
 - 5.1.6.1 Records. Records pertinent to CONSULTANT's compensation will be kept in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices. To the extent necessary to verify CONSULTANT's

charges and upon OWNER's timely request, CONSULTANT shall make copies of such records available to OWNER at cost.

5.2 Payments

- 5.2.1 Times of Payments. CONSULTANT shall submit monthly invoices for Basic and Additional Services, if authorized, rendered and for Reimbursable Expenses incurred. OWNER shall make prompt monthly payments in response to CONSULTANT's invoices.
- 5.2.2 Failure to Pay. If OWNER fails to make any payment due CONSULTANT for services and expenses within thirty days after receipt of CONSULTANT's invoices, the amounts due CONSULTANT will be increased at the rate of 1-1/2% per month (18% A.P.R.) from said thirtieth day, and in addition, CONSULTANT may, after giving seven days' written notice to OWNER, suspend services under this Agreement until CONSULTANT has been paid in full all amounts due for services and expenses.
- 5.2.3 Payments Upon Termination. In the event of termination by OWNER under Attachment D, paragraph 7.5, CONSULTANT will be entitled to invoice OWNER and to receive full payment for all services performed or furnished and all Reimbursable Expenses incurred through the effective date of termination. In the event of termination by OWNER for convenience or by CONSULTANT for cause, CONSULTANT also shall be entitled to invoice OWNER and to payment of a reasonable amount for services and expenses directly attributable to termination, both before and after the effective date of termination, such as reassignment of personnel, costs of terminating contracts with CONSULTANT's independent professional associates and subconsultants, and other related close-out costs, using methods and rates for Additional Services as set forth in this Attachment C.
- 5.2.4 Payments for Taxes Assessed on Services. The amount of any excise, value-added, gross receipts, or sales taxes that may be imposed on payments shall be added to the compensation as determined above.
- 5.2.5 Deductions or Offsets. No deductions or offsets shall be made from CONSULTANT's compensation or expenses on account of any setoffs or back charges.

ATTACHMENT D - TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This is an attachment to the Agreement dated September 12, 2022 between the City of West Allis (OWNER) and TerraVenture Advisors, LLC (CONSULTANT).

ARTICLE 7 - GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

7.1 Standard of Performance

The standard of care for all professional services performed or furnished by CONSULTANT under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of the subject profession practicing under similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality. CONSULTANT does not make any warranty or guarantee, expressed or implied, nor is this Agreement or contract subject to the provisions of any uniform commercial code. Similarly, CONSULTANT will not accept those terms and conditions offered by OWNER in its purchase order, requisition, or notice of authorization to proceed, except as set forth herein or expressly agreed to in writing. Written acknowledgement of receipt or the actual performance of services subsequent to receipt of such purchase order, requisition, or notice of authorization to proceed is specifically deemed not to constitute acceptance of any terms or conditions contrary to those set forth herein.

7.2 Reuse of Documents

At completion of project, all acquisition files and related documentation to this project will be submitted to the OWNER. All documents prepared or furnished by CONSULTANT (and independent professional associates and subconsultants) pursuant to this Agreement are instruments of service and CONSULTANT shall retain an ownership and property interest therein. OWNER may make and retain copies for information and reference in connection with use by OWNER; however, such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by OWNER or others on extensions of the Project or on any other project. Any reuse without written verification or adaptation by CONSULTANT for the specific purpose intended will be at OWNER's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to CONSULTANT, or to independent professional associates or subconsultants, and OWNER shall indemnify and hold harmless CONSULTANT and independent professional associates and subconsultants from all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorneys' fees arising out of or resulting therefrom. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle CONSULTANT to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by OWNER and CONSULTANT.

7.3 Electronic Files

7.3.1 OWNER and CONSULTANT agree that any electronic files furnished by either party shall conform to the specifications agreed to at the time this Agreement is executed and listed elsewhere. Any changes to the electronic specifications by either OWNER or CONSULTANT are subject to review and acceptance by the other party. Additional services by CONSULTANT made necessary by changes to the electronic file specifications shall be compensated for as Additional Services.

7.3.2 Electronic files furnished by either party shall be subject to an acceptance period of 60 days during which the receiving party agrees to perform appropriate acceptance tests. The party furnishing the electronic file shall correct any discrepancies or errors detected and reported within the acceptance period. After the acceptance period, the electronic files shall be deemed to be accepted and neither party shall have any obligation to correct errors or maintain electronic files.

7.3.3 OWNER is aware that differences may exist between the electronic files delivered and the printed hard-copy documents. In the event of a conflict between the hard-copy documents prepared by CONSULTANT and electronic files, the hard-copy documents shall govern.

7.4 Insurance

CONSULTANT shall procure and maintain insurance for protection from claims under workers' compensation acts, claims for damages because of bodily injury including personal injury, sickness or disease or death of any and all employees or of any person other than such employees, and from claims or damages because of injury to or destruction of property including loss of use resulting therefrom. Requirements for insurance are amended and supplemented as indicated in Attachment E. City of Racine is to be named as an additional insured.

7.5 Termination

The obligation to provide further services under this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon 30 days written notice with or without cause.

7.6 Controlling Law

This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the State of Wisconsin.

7.7 Successors and Assigns

7.7.1 OWNER and CONSULTANT each is hereby bound and the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives of OWNER and CONSULTANT (and to the extent permitted by paragraph 7.7.2 the assigns of OWNER and CONSULTANT) are hereby bound to the other party to this Agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives (and said assigns) of such other party, in respect of all covenants, agreements and obligations of this Agreement.

7.7.2 Neither OWNER nor CONSULTANT shall assign, sublet or transfer any rights under or interest in this Agreement (including, but without limitation, moneys that may become due or moneys that are due) without the written consent of the other, except to the extent mandated or restricted by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement. Nothing contained in this paragraph shall prevent CONSULTANT from employing such independent professional associates and subconsultants as CONSULTANT may deem appropriate to assist in the performance of services hereunder.

7.7.3 Nothing under this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits in this Agreement to anyone other than OWNER and CONSULTANT, and all duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole and exclusive benefit of OWNER and CONSULTANT and not for the benefit of any other party.

7.8 Dispute Resolution

7.8.1 Negotiation. OWNER and CONSULTANT agree to negotiate all disputes between them in good faith for a period of 30 days from the date of notice prior to exercising their rights under the dispute resolution provision below or other provisions of this Agreement, or under law.

7.8.2 Mediation. If direct negotiations fail, OWNER and CONSULTANT agree that they shall submit any and all unsettled claims, counterclaims, disputes, and other matters in question between them arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof to mediation in accordance with the Construction Industry Mediation Rules of the American Arbitration Association effective on the date of this Agreement prior to exercising other rights under law.

7.9 Exclusion of Special, Indirect, Consequential, and Liquidated Damages

CONSULTANT shall not be liable, in contract or tort or otherwise, for any special, indirect, consequential, or liquidated damages including specifically, but without limitation, loss of profit or revenue, loss of capital, delay damages, loss of goodwill, claim of third parties, or similar damages arising out of or connected in any way to the Project or this Agreement.

7.10 Americans with Disabilities Act

The Consultant shall use reasonable professional effort and judgment in interpreting and advising the Client as to the necessary requirements for the Project to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The Consultant shall rely on the local building department for interpretations of the ADA at the time the service is rendered. The Consultant does not warrant or guarantee that the Project will fully comply with interpretations of ADA requirements by regulatory or judicial bodies.

7.11 Affirmative Action

Consultant agrees to adopt an affirmative action plan to increase its partners, associates, and employee members of under-represented groups in all of its departments, job classifications, and salary categories. In the event that the Consultant subcontracts a portion of this agreement, the Consultant will include in its subcontracts, a requirement that its subcontractors include a similar requirement in their contracts with subcontractors.

7.12 Non-Discrimination

Consultant will not discriminate against any qualified employee or qualified applicant for employment because of race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, disability, sex, or sexual orientation. In the event any portion of this Agreement is subcontracted by Consultant, Consultant shall include in such subcontract, a provision prohibiting the subcontractor from discriminating against any qualified employee or qualified applicant for employment because of race, color, national origin, ancestry, religion, age, marital status, disability, sex, or sexual orientation.

ATTACHMENT E - INSURANCE

This is an attachment to the Agreement dated September 12, 2022 between the City of West Allis (OWNER) and TerraVenture Advisors, LLC (CONSULTANT).

ARTICLE 8 - INSURANCE

8.1 Workers' Compensation

Property damage liability coverage shall not exclude explosion, collapse, and underground perils if CONSULTANT is engaged in these activities.

Commercial General Liability coverage shall also protect the CONSULTANT for the same limits of liability for claims which may arise because of the indemnity or contractual liability agreement contained within this Agreement.

8.3 Business Automobile Liability

Business Automobile Liability insurance including Owned, Non-Owned, and Hired vehicles shall be carried with a limit of not less than the following:

8.6 Valuable Papers

During the life of this Agreement, the CONSULTANT shall maintain in force Valuable Papers and Records insurance in an amount equal to the maximum exposure to loss of written, printed, or otherwise inscribed documents and records, including books, maps, films, drawings, abstracts, deeds, mortgages, and manuscripts as shall be required and/or produced in the completion of this Agreement by the CONSULTANT.

Consultant Contract Cost Estimate Workbook Instructions:

This workbook is designed as a guideline for consulting firms to use when submitting contract cost estimates to the Department of Transportation. It is not required that firms use this workbook for submitting contract cost estimates.

However, any contract cost estimates should follow the general format shown here and in Chapter 8 of the Facilities Development Manual.

Most firms will have to make changes to the format of these worksheets when submitting estimates. On the "Hours" worksheet, for example, a project may include work under more than 15 tasks. The firm would then have to insert rows on that sheet to add in the additional tasks. Other contracts may have less than 15 tasks, so rows would have to be deleted. Inserting rows and columns can undermine formulas set in the spreadsheet to sum individual rows and columns, **so please double-check that all totals are correct when using these spreadsheets to submit contract cost estimates!**

Cells that do not need to be filled in, such as totals and titles, are shaded yellow or gray.

The footer of each form in this workbook contains the applicable FDM Procedure number.

Do not submit electronic files of this workbook. Submit only hard copies with consultant contracts. This workbook is for firms' internal use only!

Additional Notes for Submitting Contract Cost Estimates

Some contracts break down engineering costs by "lump sum", "actual cost", and "if authorized" work. Any supporting documents that require the definition of these type of costs must also include **a summary sheet for ALL work for each project on the contract.** Examples are shown on the "Hours" and "Fee Task" worksheets. If the contract does not include these different types of work (e.g. all work is "lump sum") the additional breakdown is not necessary.

Subcontractors must submit estimate sheets like those shown in this workbook. The subcontractor's original signed proposal to the prime consultant is to be submitted as well.

If a contract has multiple projects, all of the cost estimate forms--prime and subs--for each project should be on consecutive pages. Currently, most contracts list all of the prime vendor estimates for each project together and then show subcontractor estimates at the end of the contract. We prefer that the material for each project ID be kept together within the contract. For example, a contract with projects 0000-00-00 & 0000-00-01 should be laid out like this: prime vendor forms for 0000-00-00, subcontract forms for 0000-00-00, prime vendor forms for 0000-00-01, subcontract forms for 0000-00-01.

Re: Communication Regarding Closing 55th Street Railroad Crossing

City engineering staff have been discussing the W. Beloit Road and S. 55th St. at-grade railroad crossings with Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) and the WisDOT Bureau of Transit, Local Roads, Railroads and Harbors (WisDOT). Due to the aging railroad signal equipment on W. Beloit Road, UPRR must replace and upgrade the signal equipment to meet current safety standards. The new equipment will not work with the multiple closely spaced crossings, therefore we have two options:

1. Install new signal equipment at S. 55th Street to provide separation from W. Beloit Road signal equipment
2. Close S. 55th Street railroad crossing

WisDOT and UPRR agree the Beloit Road signals and gates must be upgraded with our project according to federal code. This project is funded 80% by the federal government and 20% by the city, however anything over the federal cap is 100% city responsibility.

As part of the W. Beloit Road construction project, the city has already entered into a State Municipal Agreement (SMA) with WisDOT. The estimated design and construction of the roadway and railroad crossing on W. Beloit Road is currently \$12.5 million. Federal funding is capped at \$7.8 million. The city's portion of the roadway project is approximately \$4.4 million which includes replacing the sewer and water from Lincoln to 60th Street.

Replacing the 55th St equipment is estimated to cost an additional \$600,000 vs. removing the 55th crossing which is estimated to cost an additional \$170,000. Most likely, the city could reduce the additional local share to \$0, due to railroad and WisDOT incentives associated with removing the crossing at S 55th Street. Below is a breakdown of these additional costs:

- | | |

WisDOT recommended closing the crossing at 55th Street for safety, cost, and time. S. 57th Street is approximately 650 feet away and Electric Avenue is approximately 850 feet away.

Advantages to closing S. 55th Street Railroad Crossing:

- Reduced design and coordination time (better likelihood of keeping construction on schedule in 2023)
- Improved safety by eliminating a conflict point



- UPRR would pay for the removal items within 4-feet of tracks
- UPRR typically provides a monetary incentive payment to close crossings. Usually a 5-figure sum that would be negotiated with the city.
- WisDOT provides up to a \$30,000 match for closing a crossing that can be used to construct other safety improvements.
- City would extend curb and gutter along both sides of Mobile Street across S. 55th Street and all sidewalk, pavement, curb ramps and signal equipment would be removed between the two Mobile Streets.

The engineering department recognizes that this may be a hardship for some residents in the short term. However, since the cost and delays of keeping this crossing open are so high, and other crossings are so close, we recommend sending letters to the neighborhood and holding a neighborhood meeting to discuss these options with residents. After the meeting, our recommendation would be to close the crossing.

Improving the overall safety to the public and the railroad; constructing one, safe, well maintained, public crossing and eliminating an unsafe crossing is reasonable.

The S. 55th Street railroad crossing only handles 300 or so vehicles a day. We are one accident away from either permanently closing this crossing or installing expensive safety facilities to keep the no whistle zone.

WHEREAS, Robert Monnat, d/b/a Mandel Group, Inc., duly filed with the City Clerk an application for a Conditional Use Permit; pursuant to Sec. 19.14 and 19.32 of the Revised Municipal Code of the City of West Allis, for a limited food production, event space and restaurant usage; and,

WHEREAS, after due notice, a public hearing was held by the Common Council on September 6, 2022, at 7:00 p.m. in the Common Council Chambers to consider the application; and,

WHEREAS, the Common Council, having carefully considered the evidence presented at the public hearing and the following pertinent facts noted:

1. Robert Monnat, d/b/a Mandel Group, Inc., has offices at 301 E. Erie St. Milwaukee, WI 53202.
2. The property is owned by the City of West Allis Community Development Authority, but is proposed to be purchased by the Mandel Group, Inc. The subject property is in the 1600 Block S 66 St., West Allis, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin; more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

All the land of the owner being located in the Northeast $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3, Township 6 North, Range 21 East, City of West Allis, Milwaukee County, Wisconsin, described as follows:

Lot 3 of Certified Survey Map No. 9370.
Tax Key No. 454-0655-000.
Said land being located at the 1600 Block of S. 66 St.

3. The commercial use redevelopment project area may be referred to as SoNa (South of National), the Market at Six Points and/or Makers Row. The uses will be located within attached buildings and located within a project area that is situated upon Lot 3 of CSM 9370. Expected tenants include restaurants, food product producers, and a wine bar with event space. The emphasis has been to attract local West Allis businesses and new businesses from Metro Milwaukee looking to make their mark on the industry (creative destinations), not national chains.

4. The subject development/building consists of three attached commercial buildings (about 13,200-sf) within which several tenants will operate (can be subdivided for smaller users). The

That the establishment, maintenance and operation of the proposed use, with the imposition of certain conditions hereinafter set forth, reasonably satisfies the standards set forth in Sec. 19.14 of the Revised Municipal Code, so as to permit the issuance of a Conditional Use Permit as therein provided.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Conditional Use Permit is granted subject to the following conditions:

1 Site, Landscaping, Screening and Architectural Plans, The grant of this Conditional Use Permit is subject to and conditioned upon a Site, Landscaping, Screening and Architectural

Plans approved by the West Allis Plan Commission on August 24, 2022. No alterations or modification to the approved architectural plan shall be permitted without approval by the West Allis Plan Commission.

2. Building Plans, Fire Codes and Licenses. The grant of this conditional use is subject to building plans being submitted to and approved by the Code Enforcement Department and the Fire Department. Any applicable licenses shall be applied for and approved. Seating capacity shall be in accordance with limits of occupancy load calculations as approved by Building Inspection and Fire Departments.

3. Off-Street Parking. The subject property will provide off-street parking for 51 off-street parking spaces.

4. Hours of Operation. Between all tenants, expected hours of operation are 6am - 12am daily. For the purpose of this conditional use, business operations that require a liquor license will be subject to the limitations established by the licensing and health committee and State law as it pertains to licensing or applicable permits.

5. Marketing Displays. The use of pennants, special lighting, flags, streamers or other signage typically temporary in nature, hanging, floating or attached to a structure or vehicle shall not be permitted.

6. Litter. Employees shall inspect the area and immediate vicinity and pick up litter on a daily basis. Refuse, recyclables and other waste materials will be fully enclosed within an approved structure.

7. Signage. Signage shall be permitted in compliance with the West Allis signage ordinance or approved via a variance to the code through the Plan Commission.

8. Pest Control. Exterior pest control shall be contracted on a monthly basis.

9. Deliveries and Refuse Collection. All refuse to be provided by a commercial hauler. All refuse, recyclables and other waste material shall be screened from view within a four-sided enclosure or as approved by the Department of Development to match the building. All tenants of the property will be required to abide by the City of West Allis health/public nuisance rules per Chapter 7 of the Revised Municipal Code. Because the use is residential and there is an adjacent residential neighborhood to the site, delivery operations and refuse pick up shall be permitted during daytime hours.

10. Pagers/Intercoms. The use of outdoor pagers, intercoms or loudspeakers shall not be permitted on site.

11. Outdoor Lighting. Exterior lighting on premise shall require prior approval of a lighting plan by the Planning and Zoning Office.

a) All outdoor lighting fixtures shall be directed downwards and shielded in such a manner that no light spills from the property boundaries.

b) Exterior lighting should be presented in a lighting plan which identifies all exterior lighting features, either mounted on the building or freestanding, along with dispersion pattern, intensity of light and cut-off shielding that reflects away from the street. Light distribution should not spill over onto adjacent properties.

a) "Rope" lighting or similar exposed outward facing LED lighting shall not be used in any manner that results in visible or exposed bulbs.

12. Noxious Odors, Etc. The uses shall not emit foul, offensive, noisome, noxious or disagreeable odors, gases or effluvia into the air. Mechanical systems shall be maintained to efficiently remove noxious odors.

13. Expiration of Special Use Permit. Any conditional use approved by the Common Council shall lapse and become null and void one (1) year from and after that approval if the use has not commenced, construction is not underway, or the owner has not obtained a valid building permit. An extension of these time limitations may be granted without a public hearing by the Common Council by resolution reauthorizing the conditional use in accordance with the following criteria:

A. The applicant requesting the extension shall complete a planning application available from the Planning and Zoning Office and shall submit a \$250.00 extension fee.

B. A written explanation for the extension of time shall accompany the planning application along with a timeline/schedule for obtaining necessary permits, zoning, state and municipal approvals and a target date for construction start;

C. The request for extension shall be submitted within sixty (60) days of the expiration of the conditional use permit;

D. The extension, if granted, shall be valid for a period of six (6) months. If no building permit has been issued and construction has not commenced within six (6) months from and after the extension has been granted, the conditional use shall become null and void.

14. Miscellaneous.

A. Applicants are advised that the foregoing conditions are reasonably necessary to protect the public interest and to secure compliance with the standards and requirements specified in Sec. 19.14 of the Revised Municipal Code; that the issuance of the special use is expressly subject to compliance with said conditions.
